The balance of my perishable property to wit
my negromaid Milly horses Cows hogs and
all the balance of my plantation tools to be
sold at public sale twelve months credit
New I give and bequeath to my half brother
Andrew Nickerson all the benefits arising
from a disputed piece of land lying on sink
ing creek in Virginia Montgomery County
to him and his heirs forever I give and bequeath
to my half brother Edward Nickerson

Bottoms a tract of twenty eight acres of four shill
ings each, and one tract of forty Dollars
in Samuel Gorton likewise thirty Dollars levied
out of my property that shall be sold to him &
his heirs New I give and bequeath unto Polly Black
and a dearly beloved wife two hundred Dollars
arising from the sale of my property to her & her
heirs forever New I give and bequeath to William
and Jeffries all the balance of my property arising
from the sale of my negromaid and perish
able property exposed to sale after my just
Debt are discharged the two hundred Dollars
my wife Polly Black is to have and thirty dol
lars my half brother Immanuel Nickerson
is to have then the balance to him and his heirs
forever Also I give to said William and Jeffries
and great Coat and my Black suit coat and
+ Breaches forever After the decease or marriage of
my dearly beloved wife Polly Black It is my will
the plantation I now live in be sold and equally
divided between my sons Nephews David Samuel
C. Purpus Samuel Kenan Samuel Nickerson
