Dollar each in property I mean to do the same
by the rest as they come ^{of age} in many therefore my
Will and desire is that a young mare which
I got of Joseph Musely and a saddle ^{to the} ther-
her and furniture a Bed and chair & a Case
and Lamb shall be given to my Daughter
Temperance Mow at her marriage or when she
comes of age I give to my son Blair Mow
a horse saddle and Bridle as good to one
hundred Dollar price as my executor can
fix

fix it and if their value should fall under
they shall make it up in cash to be delivered
to him at the age of twenty one years.
I give to my Daughter Ally Mow a young
saddle & mare of my own raising three years
old next spring also a new saddle and Bridle
to be got for her as good as my executor can
fix it also a Feather Bed and furniture &
a Case and Lamb and a case and Lamb to be
given her at her marriage or when she
comes of age I give to my son Thomas Mow
a Black yearling Colt brought by Colah
also a saddle and Bridle and whatever
the mare Saddle and Bridle shall fall
share of the price of one hundred Dollar
shall be made up to him in cash at the age of
twenty one years and also one year's schooling
as near as can be when he arrives to the age of
sixteen years after which he may be put to
a trade unless he chuses to stay and do for
his Mother if he does chuse to stay he shall
receive for his services what my executor
shall think equivalent I give to my grand
son Vincent Mow McMurtry a complete

well finished Rifle gun double triggered
 elegantly stocked and mounted with Brass
 to be made by a gunsmith of his fathers choi-
 sing and size of the bird of his own choosing and
 the same to be delivered to him as soon as he
 has killed one squirrel. I lend to my beloved
 wife Tabitha Mow during her natural
 life and Widow Koon the whole of my
 estate both real and personal that has not
 already been given and may at her option give
 to any of her children any thing she pleases so
 that it is within the bounds of their portions
 and the part given to my executors and they
 to make an estimation of its value which
 they shall enter as a charge against such
 child and consider it as part of my estate
 at the decease of my wife I desire that my
 negro woman Kila have the liberty of chus-
 ing which of my children she will live with
 and her value fixed only by my executors which
 value shall be considered as so much of their
 portion ^{and for my daughter Sally I give to my daughter Temperance Mow}
 of my estate and she to pay or receive
 whatever it is more or less than her equal part

of my estate I give to my Daughter Sally McMur-
 try at the decease of my wife my half of the distillery
 and its apparatus which shall be valued by men
 who know the value and the value thereof consid-
 ered as part of my estate ^{part of it} of their estate all
 the rest of my estate both real and personal
 I desire may be sold at twelve months end
 and divided in such manner as will make
 all my children equal counting or adding
 to the amount of sale to the amount of sale
 the value of Kila and the distillery if any
 of my children should die without issue I
 desire their part shall be equally divided among
 the rest I also allow my beloved wife to have
 the liberty of selling the place where I now live
 and where she thinks proper & the pro-
 perty to be legally released and for the
 Business of executorship to be intrusted with my
 son Claiborne or some other person where
 she may see fit I appoint my friends William
 Brown senior and Alex. McMurtry Execu-
 tors of this my last Will and Testament
 revoking all former Wills and desire they
 have no Inventory taken of my estate In
