and Amos Reed the tract of land
that I now live on to be divided by a
line from the beginning corner to the
line where it crosses the branch that runs
through the field John Reed the upper
part and Amos Reed the lower part
I then, I give and Bequeath unto Richard
Reed the slave man and the white
boy, I then, I ordain John and Amos
Reed give David McCollum six pounds
a piece when he is twenty years of age
I then, I allow Rufus Carpenter to have the
care David McCollum until he is twenty
one years of age and he must give him
two years schooling I then I give and
Bequeath unto John Maize five shillings
of my Estate I then I give and bequeath
unto Richard Parkin four shillings
of my Estate

the Table & cooking use but in ^{case} ~~case~~ she should
marry then it is my will that the last mentioned
articles shall be reckoned as part of my Estate
and to be sold for benefit of Children herein
named (to wit) Betsey ~~and my~~ ^{and my} &
Polly & my will and desire is that
the Residue of ^{my} Personal Estate shall be
Sold at public auction giving twelve months
credit for the best price that can be had &
the proceeds of sale to be let out at interest
for the benefit of my said Children
by my will and desire is that the tract of
Land where I now live shall be and remain
in the possession of my said wife during
her life or widowhood for the purpose of
her own maintenance and of maintaining
Schooling and raising my said Children
But in case my said wife & I should

then it is my will that the said tract of Land
shall be rented out yearly for the best price
that can be had and the proceeds thereof to go
to the raising Schooling and maintaining my
said Children until they shall come of age at
which time my will it that an equal division
shall be made and distributed unto my said Children
by my will and desire is that the residue of my land
shall be rented out yearly for the best price that
can be had and the proceeds thereof to go to the use of
Schooling and maintaining my said Children
until they shall come of full age and then it
is my will and desire that an equal division
of the whole of my Estate both real and personal
shall be made & distributed equally to my said
Children and Lastly I do constitute and appoint
Henry Mazy ~~my~~ Executor of this my last will
