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In the name of God Amen
 I Henry Muntich of full age and being in a Sick and low Situation as to body but thanks be to god sound as to memory and judgement but calling to mind the mortality of my body that it was appointed for all men once to Die. I do declare this my last will and testament in manner and form following, first at Death I committed my Soul to the hand of God that gave it and my body to the earth from whence it came to be Buried in a Christian like manner at the Discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the great and gen^l Resurrection I shall receive the Same Body raised up by the all mighty Power of God and as to such worldly goods as it hath pleased God to bestow on me with Meane and Dispose of them in manner and form following first (that is to say) I leave at my Death it is my will that my negro woman Eliza and her two Sons Eliza the Oldest and John her Youngest Should live free Meane 1st and to such house hold kitchen furniture as have got I leave to the above Eliza. I leave 5th and to horses cattle and hogs to be left to the Discretion of ^{my} Executors to be managed by them after making out of them an amount for their
