

to be sold to the Negroes here and the money
to be divided among the rest of my children
after all my reasonable expenses my daughter
Sarah & son Moses is to have his part of the
estate Also my wife is to have two hundred
weight of pork and ten barrels of corn for her
support this being my last will and
testamento in the name of God amen
