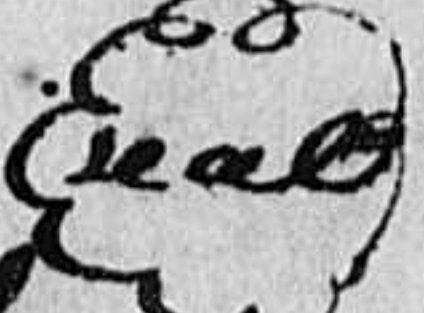

This last will and testament of Joseph
Marshall dec^d was produced in Court at the January
Term 1811 and proven by the oaths of Adam Mitchell
and Saml Marshall Jur^s & afterwards at the April
Term and same year was fully proven by the oath
of Saml Brents and ordered to be recorded which is
done accordingly

In the name of God Amens. I David
Preece of Green County and now living on little
Brush Creek being now weak in body but of perfect
mind, do make this my last will and Testament
Revoking all others heretofore made by me in
manner and form following (to wit) Item, I give to
my son Daniel Preece fifty acres of Land out of the
tract I now live on to begin on the creek and to run
up the creek and with the fence of the plantation on
which I live to include the babbar in which he now
lives. I give to my son James Preece the land on which
he now lives being a part of the tract I now live on
laying on the South side of the creek and bounded by Mr.
Nathl. Owens and Mr James Moneys lines and the creek
being land that my son Jonas purchased of me and has
no obligation on me for the same, I give to my
beloved wife Anna Preece the use and profits of the
plantation whereon I now live together with the one
third of the balance of my estate both real and personal
and of every description whatsoever during her natural
life. and at the death of my wife I give the plantation
with the balance of the land not heretofore devised

to my youngest daughter Leicy Preece and also
I give to her at my decease one feather bed & furniture
one sorrel filly and one bow & ball. The balance of
my estate is to be sold and after all my just debts
are paid the remainder I give in equal proportion
to my children hereafter named, To Elenor Scott,
William Powell Preece, Jonas Preece, John Preece
Mary Pepper, Precilla Perry, Lydia Money, David
Preece, Susannah Munn and Leicy Preece the one
third of my estate which I have left to my wife in
care that she should be the longest lived I have at
her own disposal to be given by her to whomsoever
she may please, made and concluded this 11th
of February in the year of our Lord 1811 Signed

the general Resurrection I shall receive the same again, by the
