Item I likewise constitute my wife Mary Tanner executrix and George Tibbs executor of this my last will and testament and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannul all and every other former wills Legacies and requests and Executors by me or any ways before named will, and bequeath, ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my Last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this ninth day of June one thousand eight hundred and eleven signed sealed and delivered by the said Joel Tanner as his Last will & Testament Joel Tanner

 whereon I now live with all the farming utensils
 thereunto belonging and also my negro man named
 Bob to him and his heirs for ever and all the rest of
 my property be it of what so ever kind it may be
 my will and desire is that it shall be equally
 divided amongst my other five children at my
 widows death viz Mary Linsey John McColgan
 James McColgan ~~Ann~~ Mary Skiggs Grissy
 McColgan, also I appoint my wife Mary Ann
 McColgan whole and sole executrix
