make this my last will and testament. And first I commend

doubting but God will raise it up at the last day.

And as for my worldly substance I do dispose of it in the
manner following, Viz, to my beloved wife Anna I do will
and bequeath a decent and comfortable support of the land
I now live, so long as she may which land I do
bequeath to my son Josiah and that there be a
full title made to him of the same as soon as
obtained and that two work-horses, four milch cows
and a flock of hogs with the tools necessary for working the
land remain on the place for the support of the family
I do will and bequeath to my son Alexander twenty
shillings, Again I do will and bequeath to my son James
the sum of twenty shillings, then I do will and bequeath
all my other lawfull debts and

paid, I do will and bequeath to my son William
of twenty six pounds, then the Ballance remaining of my personal
estate I do will and bequeath to my two daughters, Viz,
and Susanah to be equally divided between them except so
much of the house-hold furniture as will be necessary for
comfortable support of the remainder of the family. Again
I do will and ordain that my son Josiah shall pay unto my
daughter Susanah the sum of twenty pounds. Again I do
ordain that my son Samuel be put to a trade that
appear most suitable for him, and have the learning that
is necessary for managing common business. Again I do
ordain that my two sons, Viz, Alexander and James my whole and sole
to see that this my last will and testament be punctually
plied with. And I do ordain this to be my last will and testament
and do hereby revoke and make void all others. As witness my
hand and seal this twentieth day of March in the year of
our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety eight.
