Item I likewise constitute my wife Mary Tanner executrix and George Tibbs executor of this my last will and testament and I do hereby utterly disavow revoke and disannul all and every other former wills Legacies and requests and Executors by me or any ways before named will, and bequeath, ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my Last will and Testament.
