Joseph Marshall
In the name of god amen. I Joseph Marshall
of Green County and state of Kentucky being weak
of body but of good and perfect mind and
memory, and calling to mind that it is appointed
for all men to die do make and Ordain this
as my last will and Testament hereby revoking
all other wills either verbal or written, by
me heretofore made.

And first I give up my soul into
the hands of almighty god who first gave it and
my body to be buried in decent burial at the dis-
cretion of my executor hereafter to be named, and
as to such earthly estate wherewith it hath pleased
god to bless me I give demise & bequeath in
manner & form following to wit

I give to my beloved wife Frances

Marshall the use of my plantation whereon I
now live, and the negro woman Nancy, Negro
man Peter & the Negro Boy Burwell, which planta-
tion & negroes she is to have during her natural life
and should the negro woman aforesaid have any future
increase, I will such increase to be equally divided
between my wife during and daughter Patsy that
is to say to my wife during her natural life & the
whole to my daughter afterwards

I will that my executor sell for the
purpose of paying my debts & supporting the farm
the next cropping season my horse Redbird and Roan
Mare. — I give to my daughter Patsy Marshall

all the negroes Darcus and her increase if any &
Elliot to be given up to her on marriage or arrival
to the age of fifteen years old, my daughter however
to be under the care and direction of her mother and
the negroes also to be in her possession until the
period aforesaid for the purpose aforesaid of enabling
her to educate my daughter and at the death
of my wife I give to my said daughter all my

estate both real and personal. I give also to my daughter a horse saddle & bridle at the discretion of my executors on marriage or at the age aforesaid and in case my said daughter should die before marriage or the age aforesaid I then give to my said wife all the estate devised to my daughter to be entirely subject to her disposal
My Household & kitchen furniture (except one bed and furniture which my daughter is to have on marriage or the age aforesaid) as also my farming tools & the ballance of my stock of every kind I give to my wife during life and after to my daughter.

I will that my executors pay & satisfy all my just debts & contracts. I constitute and appoint my friends John Marshall & Robert Garboe my whole & sole executors of this my last will & testament.

In testimony of all which I hereunto set my hand & affix my seal this 6th day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eleven

The words " & Daughter Patsy " in the first page and the words " and her inlaws if any " in the second page interlined before signed.

I. Joseph Marshall having further considered the above will do think proper to make the following alteration thereto to wit It is my will and desire that my daughter Patsy be well clothed & educated under the direction & at the discretion of my executors, & that one of my beds & furniture be sold and the proceeds applied & paid to my said daughter at the age of fifteen years or marriage & that my wife have my black mare. It is further my will & desire that my plantation be rented out the ensuing season and the ballance of my stock farming tools and such of my household & kitchen furniture as my wife may not choose to keep be sold by my executors. It is also my will & desire that my Negroes be hired out by my executors yearly and should my wife marry that such of them as I have given to my wife be then given up

to her and the proceeds of this here paid to her yearly as the same may become due whether she be single or married, and that the proceeds of the negro given to my daughter be applied to the proper care and education of my daughter until her marriage or arrival to the age of fifteen years and that then any balance of the hire of said negro be paid to her. This last will and testament of Joseph Marshall dec^d was produced in Court at the January Term 1811 and proven by the oaths of Adam Mitchell and Saml Marshall Jur^s & afterwards at the April Term and same year was fully proven by the oath of Saml Brents and ordered to be recorded which is done accordingly

In the name of God Amen. I David Preece of Green County and now living on little Brush Creek being now weak in body but of perfect mind, do make this my last will and Testament Revoking all others heretofore made by me in manner and form following (to wit) Item, I give to my son Daniel Preece fifty acres of Land out of the tract I now live on to begin on the creek and to run up the creek and with the fence of the plantation on which I live to include the bottom in which he now lives. I give to my son James Preece the land on which he now lives being a part of the tract I now live on laying on the South side of the creek and bounded by Mr. Nathl. Owens and Mr. James Moneys lines and the creek being land that my son Jonas purchased of me and has no obligation on me for the same, I give to my beloved wife Anna Preece the use and profits of the plantation whereon I now live together with the one third of the balance of my estate both real and personal and of every description whatsoever during her natural life. and at the death of my wife I give the plantation with the balance of the land not heretofore devised
