

Satisfaction of W^m Simpson my said Executor that such poor children was reduced to poverty by unavoidable accident, and that it must be expressly understood that no one shall be entitled to any part of my estate who has or may be reduced to need by their parents misconduct or extravagance it is to be further known that I allow this donation to any such ~~poor~~ orphan child where ever it may reside within the knowledge of my executor above mentioned, I being entirely free from debt therefore direct that William Simpson my Executor give no security, and reposing special confidence in his honesty, and I do hereby utterly disavow & disannul all and every former will & bequest and bequests ratifying this and no other to be my Last will and Testament in witness whereof I set my hand and seal this the 18th of Feby. the year of our Lord Christ 1806 Signed sealed, pronounced and delivered by the said William Sizer in the County of Green and State of Kentucky in the presence of John Moore

In the name of God AMEN I Valentine Sublett of Green County and State of Kentucky being at present truly sick in body but sound in mind so that I think the Lord hath appointed shortly to lead me out of this world. I have therefore determined to make my Testament and commit to writing my last will in the form following V. - In the first place I resign my soul into the hands of God who gave it, and desire that my body be decently buried according to the custom of the Baptist Church. - Next as to the portion of property which God has given me to of which I desire that all lawful demands against me be paid also I bequeath unto my beloved wife Margutt Sublett during her natural life all the household furniture as well as all the moveable property which I now possess, One Negroe Girl named Jude, and one slave mare excepted the property consisting of four Negroes and three head of neat cattle, and after her decease, I desire that an equal divide of said Property take place between my four sons W^m. Allen, Branch Field, and William also an equal divide of all my Lands to be made between the four above mentioned including the Plantation where I now reside which I give to my son Fields Sublett without paying any

to Quatity, I also give unto him the Sorrel Mare
above mentioned and unto my daughter Susanah
Blifton, I lend the Negro Girl Jude above excepted
for during life, should the Negro survive her and
in order this my last will will be carried into full
effect I appoint Liberty Green and Daniel Henry
my Executors to execute the same. In witness
whereof I hereunto set my hand and affix my seal this
11th day of February 1808

at David, Molly, Franky, Wilson, Anny, Belia, Fanny
also a Negro woman by the name of Edith, the aforesaid

Negroes I give unto my loving wife Martha Williams to
have and to hold forever to be at her disposal at her death
Item, I give and bequeath unto my ^{Loving} wife Martha Williams
four head of Horses namely Charlotte, Schrack Ool, Top Gallant,
and Hammer and Tong, the aforesaid Horses I give unto my
loving wife Martha Williams to have and to hold forever.

Item, I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Martha
Williams all my house hold and Kitchen furniture, to have
and to hold forever, two good fether beds and furniture
excepted. —

Item, I also give and bequeath unto my
Loving wife Martha Williams one third part of all my
plantation working tools, also one third part of all the
crop that will be made the present year to dispose of
as she may think proper, Item, I give and bequeath
unto my loving wife Martha Williams the tract of Land
I now live on containing about four hundred and forty
four acres, to have and to hold during her natural life
at her death it is my will and desire that said land
should be returned unto my loving Children. Item, I also
give and bequeath unto my loving wife Martha
Williams one third part of all my stock of cattle and
hogs, and it is further my will and desire that she
should have all my stock of sheep, Item, I give and
bequeath unto my loving Children, Jane Watson and
Athene Scott all the rest and residue of my estate
except Lands that has not been already divided, &c.
