

In the name of God Amen, this 10.th day of January 1799.

I William Bogeland of Green County and State of Kentucky being sick in body but of good and perfect memory and calling to remembrance the uncertain Estate of this transitory life and that all flesh must yield to God, I therefore make this my last Will and testament (revoking and disannulling all other former will or wills by me heretofore made signed or acknowledged) to be completed in form following.

Imprimis, I commit my soul unto God my body to body to be buried as shall seem right at the discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned.

2^d I desire that all my Just debts be settled and paid.

3^d I give and bequeath unto my son Abraham Bogeland fifty three and half acres of land to be taken off the upper end of this tract I now live on forever.

4th I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Bogeland the Balance of this tract whereon I now live enduring her natural life and after to descend to my daughter Anne and to the heirs of her body lawfully begotten forever, as also I give and bequeath all and singular my moveable estate to be given and kept as my before mentioned wife shall see fit.

5th I give and bequeath unto my son James Bogeland a tract of land lying and being in said State and County

6th I bought of my son Isaac Bogeland

6th and lastly I appoint and constitute my beloved wife Elizabeth Bogeland Executrix of this my last will and testament signed and acknowledged by me William Bogeland the day and date above written

I William Walker of Green County and State of Kentucky being weak and Low in body but in perfect mind and memory do make, signify and appoint this to be my last will and testament in manner and form following Viz I lend unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Walker during her life and for her use the schooling and raising my two children Thomas and Nancy Walker (at her discretion, my land and plantation where I now live with the appurtenances thereto belonging, with my Negroes Abby, also one half my stock, plantation utensils, household and kitchen furniture, and the other half my stock, plantation utensils, household and kitchen furniture I lend to my said wife Elizabeth Walker untill my son Thomas Walker and daughter Nancy becomes of age, then the last said half to be equally divided between said Thomas and Nancy Walker. I also and my said wife Elizabeth Walker my Negro (or mulatto) Boy Bob for service

the date hereof.

Item. I give and bequeath to my son Jeremiah Walker my Negroe (or Mulatto) boy Bob to be delivered to him at the end of seven years from the date hereof, provided my decease is before the expiration of the said seven years and in case I live longer than seven years from this day, then the said Boy, Bob, to be delivered to him as soon as my Executors can be qualified and other necessary steps taken.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Thomas Walker after his mother's death, my land and plantation with the appurtenances I also give and bequeath him my Negroe Boy Billy.

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Nancy Walker my Negroe (or Mulatto) Girl Sarah. It is my will and desire that after the death of my wife all the personal estate I have left her with the increase thereof be equally divided between my son Thomas Walker and my daughter Nancy Walker and that if either the said Thomas or Nancy Walker die before they arrive at lawfull age or without heir lawfully begotten of their body that the surviving one have that part of my estate bequeathed to the deceased one. As my sons John Jones Walker and Jas. Walker and Martha Gilbert Bond has already been provided for in some part, I give to each of them twenty five cents. I appoint my wife Elizabeth Walker, and Luke Bond my Executors and Executrix of this my last will and testament under my hand and seal this thirtieth

that my body be decently buried and do hereby appoint Roger
Mourning of Green County and State of Kentucky and also John
Mourning of Adams County and State aforesaid to execute this my
last will and testament. In the first place I desire that all
my just debts be paid out of my estate, after which I will and
bequeath unto Peggy, Polly and Jincy Mourning three several man-
to be equally and proportionably divided amongst them, I also
give unto John Mourning a Parshaw place with all tacklings
belonging thereto, also I will and bequeath unto Sally Stiffly a
large salt bottle all the remainder of my property consisting of
two horse creatures, the plantation I purchased of John
my crop of corn, and whatever else there may be
