-nd sense and perfect memory and calling to
mind the certainty of death and the uncertainty when
it will come being desirous of settling all my
Temporal concerns do make constitute and ap-
-point this and this only to be my last will
and Testament revoking disannulling and ma-
-king void all wills heretofore made by me

First I give and resign my soul into the
hands of God who made it and my body
to be decently buried at the expence of my
Estate and what temporal Estate It hath pleased God
to Bless me with it is my will and desire
should be divided as followeth I give
and bequeath to Mrs. Laramona McCarty wife of

Cornelius McCarty my riding mare that I now have
here. Item, I give and Bequeath unto Cornelius McCarty
all my stock hogs I now have both gentle and wild in
the woods.

Item, I give unto Thomas McCarty Jun^r my saddle.

Item I give and Bequeath to Hardridge McCarty
(son to Cornelius) my Bridles and saddle bags
Item It is my will and desire that out of the Cash
I have in hand my Doctor fees and other necessary
expenses should be paid.

Item, What cash remains unexpended and all my
bonds that I now have after all my Just Debts is
paid be lodged in the hands of my Executor to be by
him kept and distributed as followeth.

Item, I appoint Shadrach Brown my Executor
of this my last will and Testament and it is my will
and desire that he collect all my Debts by bonds and
open Account and apply the money towards repairs of
the meeting house that he is a member of or to assist
in building a new one and principally towards reliev-
-ing the poor persons living about this neighborhood and
in this County as to him shall seem Just and their
necessities require.

Item In case Shadrach Brown should die be una-
-ble or unwilling to act as Executor I appoint
Cornelius McCarty to act in his place giving him
all the powers that I have given Shadrach Brown
In witness whereof I have I have here unto set
my hand and affixed my seal this the
twenty sixth day of June 1870

Children and should my wife Mary chose to marry then it is my desire for her to have the one third part of the before mentioned property during her life Imprimus It is my desire after the death or marriage of my wife for my estate to be Equally Divided between my six Children to wit, Nicholas McIntire son of McIntire, Charles & Morrice McIntire, James McIntire, Elijah McIntire, & Moses McIntire and Mary McIntire my Children then it is my desire for the balance of my Estate should be sold to pay my Just Debts Lastly it is my desire that my wife Mary McIntire should be my Exetrix my friend John Churchill should be my Exeter In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand this 8th day of February 1810, Intertined before signed in the seventeenth line the words for the support of my wife & Children

The Codicil of this My last will is as follows that my negro man Abraham be disposed off by my Exetrix and Executor to pay my Debts After the same are satisfied if any residue remains after the sale of him and the rest of my property not in my will otherwise disposed off then it is my will that the same be laid out in the purchase of a negro boy or girl to be placed in the same situation that the negro man Abraham was by my will for the use of my wife and support of my Children and as I am of the opinion my wife Mary is now pregnant
