Kennedy of the County of Hardin & State of Kentucky Considering the uncertainty of this mortal life being in perfect health & sound memory Blessed to almighty God for the same do make & publish this my last Will & Testament in manner of am as follows to wit In the first place I order all my Just Debts & funeral Expenses be paid, Item I Give & bequeath unto my beloved wife wife Sarah Kennedy the One third part of all my Estate real & personal during her life time & after her decease the Real Estate to descend to my son John & Thos Kennedy to be Equally divided between them & the personal Estate to be disposed at her own will Item I Give & Bequeath unto my sons John & Thomas Kennedys the Plantation on which I now live containing two Hundred Acres in two tracts to be Equally divided Between them the home place whereon I now live to fall to my son Thomas & the place whereon my son John now lives to fall to him by taking the som all tract in his part that lies by its self to them their heirs & assigns forever Item I give and bequeath unto my eldest son Saml Kennedy the sum of Twenty Dollars to be paid out of my Estate after my decease by my sons John & Thomas Equally Between them Item I Give & Bequeath unto my son Thomas Kennedy all my Farming Attensils & all my Stock of every description Also all my house hold & Kitchen furniture to him & his heirs forever, Item I Give and bequeath unto my Eldest Daughter Mary Chalfan the sum of four Dollars Item I Give & Bequeath unto my other four Daughters

to Elizabeth I Husted the Sum of Thirty Dollars to Nancy Walker the Sum of four Dollars To Sally Ashcraft a horse to be worth forty Dollars & to Susannah Martin the sum of four Dollars all of which said several Legacies or Sums I will & Order shall be paid to the said Respective legatees within one year after my decease by my son Tho<sup>s</sup> & further my three grandsons James Daniel & John Kennedy's sons of give & bequeath unto my sons Stephen & Robert Kennedy a horse Saddle & Bridle each when they arrive at full age to be paid out of my Estate by my sons John & Tho<sup>s</sup> I do also further constitute & appoint my sons John & Thomas Kennedy my Paul Executors of this my last Will Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 31<sup>st</sup> day of March in the year of our Lord One thousand eight Hundred & fourteen

Item I Give to my son Benjamin Murphy Elizabeth & Nancy the whole of my Real and personal Estate after the Death of my wife Except my son James Murphy which shall have one ninth part I turn the whole of the property to be kept together after Pacing my Just Debts I turn I leave to my son John Murphy One Dollar likewise to William Murphy one Dollar likewise to Philip Murphy one Dollar likewise to Elloner Millon Ten Dollars in Trade likewise to Sally Hoback ten Dollars in Trade. I like wise recommend my wife Nancy Murphy And Isaac Hoback as my Executors & Executrix as Witnesses my hand the day and date before written
