I Isaac Jones of the County of Hardin and State of Kentucky being in the possession of a sound mind but under sore afflictions in body and believing that it is my indispensable duty in as much as I have no children to provide for, to secure unto my wife my property least after my decease my brother and there children might take apart from her, and my Estate being but small there would not be a sufficient left for her support &c under these impressions I make the following agreement, to wit Item 1st I do hereby order my Executors to pay all my last debts together with my funeral expences out of my personal estate Item 2nd I do hereby bequeath and forever give unto my well beloved wife Elizabeth Jones all my property both real and personal after the payment of my debts as above to be used or disposed of in what way she may think best and most for her benefit and interest. Item 3rd I do hereby constitute and appoint Arthur M. Gaughey Jr and James Wilkason my trusty friends executors to carry into effect this Will and Testament In Witnes whereunto I have hereunto set my hand this 30th day

March 1816
