which ever she thinks proper to keep likewise
two or three Cows which she chooses likewise
all the money due me she is collect
it and pay for the land I now live
on and pay of my Debts and this
land I now live on she is to keep
during life or as long as she keeps any
of the children, Thirteen hundred acres
of land lying in a Survey entered and
surveyed in the name of Henry Banks

150a The thirteen hundred acres is to be laid off as my
wife thinks proper and is to be divided Equally
Between my children the Balance of the tract
Eastwardly I leave to Daniel Linder my father
that is all my title of the said land and my
Father is to be at all expences two Hundred and
fifty acres of land the place where Hugh
Johnson now lives Beginning on Sulcers
Westward line so as to include the Improvement
I leave to Abraham Linder my Brother that
is all my right and title
As for the land I leave to my Father my request
is that my Father shall give Andrew Linder
Israel Linder and Samuel Linder two hundred
acres a piece out of the land I will him
this Will I do hereby acknowledge and
and assign this day and date above
