
At a County Court began and held for

being of sound and perfect mind memory
but weak in Body do make this my last
will and Testament in manner and form fol
lowing to wit, I give and bequeath unto my

Negroes. One Negro woman named Liddy
for the Term of fifteen years then she the
said Liddy to be free One Negro Boy
named Harry about Eight years old and
one Negro Girl named Liza my Waggan
and Team and all my house hold and kitch
en furniture and plantation Utensils. I give
and bequeath unto my son George Nelson
one Negro Woman named Lott and her
Increase he yielding and paying unto
my daughter Easter one hundred Dollars
when she shall arise at full age Also one
hundred dollars unto my Daughter Ann
when she shall arise at full age and Also
one hundred dollars unto my Daughter Mary
when she shall arise at full age I Also give
and Bequeath unto my said son George
Nelson all the money due me on obligations
or Notes yielding and paying unto my son
William Perry two hundred Dollars Lawfull
money I give and Bequeath unto my son
John Alfred one Negro Boy named John

I give and Bequeath unto my son Joseph
 one Negro Boy named Bill. I give and
 Bequeath unto my son George Nelson
 my Blacksmiths Tools to be held in Trust
 by him for the use of my son Archibald
 Anderson I give and Bequeath unto my
 son Thomas Two hundred dollars to be paid
 him by wife Ann I give and Bequeath
 unto my Beloved wife one hundred and
 five Dollars which is due me from my son
 John Reid, Also I give and Bequeath
 unto my said wife my Ready money now
 in hand and all my stock of Sheep but
 will that if my beloved wife should con-
 tract marriage or die then it is my will
 that all that part of my Estate devised by
 this my will shall be equally divided
 Between my said three Daughters Mary Esau
 and Ann and my aforsaid son Thomas
 and lastly I constitute and appoint
 my beloved wife Ann my sole Executor
 of this my last will and Testament In

named Boots and one horse the chois of my stock
Item second I lend to my Daughter Patsy Gresson
Bell one negro Gil named Katy also the
second chois of my stock of horses during
her natural life and then to be equally divided
between her children, Item third I will and
bequeath to my son Williams Wood one negro
man named George, Item fourth I will
and bequeath to my Daughter Sally Lewis
one Negro Gil named Miry and also
the third chois of my stock of horses
Item fifth I will and bequeath to my
son Lewis Wood one negro Boy named Jim
Item sixth I will and bequeath to my

son Jesse Wood one Negro Boy named Ben
Item seventh I will and bequeath to my
Daughter Betsey one Negro Gil named
Caster also one Sorrel Mare named Dancy
and her saddle and Bridle also two cows
and calves the chois of my stock of cows
Item eighth I will and bequeath to my
daughter Susanna one Negro Gil named
Mitica also one Bay mare named Pick
-pocket and her saddle and Bridle also two
Cows and calves the second chois of my stock
of cows, Item ninth my will and desire is
that my negro woman Chartot and her
Increase from this date together with all
of my house hold and kitchen furniture be
equally divided between my two younger daughters
Betsey and Susanna when either of them
marry and should either of them die before
marriage my desire is that the other shall
heir the Estate of the deceased one
Item tenth my will and desire is that the
tract of land where on I now lives together
with the Residue of my stock of every kind
and my plantation utensels be sold and the
money arising therefrom be equally divided
between my children John, Patsy Gresson,
Bell, Williams, Sally Lewis, Lewis, and
Jesse. Item Eleventh I hereby constitute
my sons William Lewis & Jesse Executors
to this my last will and Testament
