

I Mary Bruce of the County of Hardin and State of Kentucky being infirm in Body, but in perfect health, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in order following that is to say, I give and recommend my soul to into hands of almighty God that gave it, and my Body I recommend to the earth to be decently interred at the discretion of my Exe cutrice an touching such worldly Estate which it hath pleased God to bless me with, I Will and bequeath in the following manner and form; Item, I bequeath to Daisey Stiger my beloved Daughter the sum of twenty pounds part of my Fathers Estate due from his Exe cutors James Ray living in the State of Pennsylvania also I give to my beloved Daughter Mary Bruce whom I likewise constitute, make and ordain the sole Exe cutrice of this my last Will and Testament all and singular the Ballance of cash that is coming from my Fathers Estate Paul Barnett also all my stock and household furniture by her freely to possess and enjoy, and I do hereby utterly, disallow revoke and disannul ^{all} and every other former Testaments and Wills by me in any ways before named Will and bequeath ther Ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament. 

Pursuant to an Order of the County Court of Mendon County bearing date February Term 1811, to us directed we John Hodgen Benj^r Wright & Samuel Martin met on the premises whereon Sophia Dodge now lives & proceeded to divide said Land (and have allotted to the widow & Heirs of Josiah Dodge deceased three several parts agreeably to the above plat each of the above Lots No 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, being 1/4 pole in width on the Original line lying parallel to each other Lot No 1 60 poles on the Original line thence with an other of the Original lines 105 poles to a Sugar tree Corner to the Widows Lot thence S. 7. E 60 poles to a Stake in the line of lot No 2. Giving the Widow the residue of the tract. Given ^{from} under our hands this 19th February 1814
