In the name of God Amen I John Ferguson of the County of Hardin, and State of Kentucky being in a law State of Health but of a sound and disposing mind, and bawling to mind, the mortality of Body and the certainty of death, do make constitute and ordain this and no other to be my last will and testament hereby rendering null and void, all other Wills or Legacies heretofore made or bequeathed, First I Give my Soul to all mighty god, who gave it to me and my body to the Grave to be buried in a Christian like manner under the directions of my Executors Here after named Secondly I will and bequeath unto my daughter Edney Nicholas one Horse creature to be worth thirty Dollars and one Cow and calf worth ten Dollars, Thirdly I will and bequeath unto my beloved wife Katy Ferguson, all the residue of my Property both Personally and real during her life, to dispose of as she may think Best for the Support of my family to sell and

Convey any of my lands or other property at will and under no constraint and to pay of my debts and after her death all the property both personal and real then in her possession to be equally divided between my children, forshly it is my will and desire that none of my property should be conveyed or sold unless by the consent of my wife and it is further my will and desire and I do hereby appoint my wife Katy my Sole Executrice to this my last will and Testament and that she is not to be bound to give Bond and Security in Court as such whereunto I have heretofore set my hand and affixed my seal this 21st day of June 1813

Kennedy of the County of Hardin & State of Kentucky Considering the uncertainty of this mortal life being in perfect health & sound memory Blessed to almighty God for the same do make & publish this my last Will & Testament in manner & form as follows to wit In the first place I order all my Just Debts & funeral Expenses be paid, Item I Give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Sarah Kennedy the One third part of all my Estate real & personal during her life time & after her decease the Real Estate to descend to my son John & Thos Kennedy & to be Equally divided between them & the personal Estate to be disposed at her own Will Item I Give & Bequeath unto my sons John & Thomas Kennedys the Plantation on which I now live containing two Hundred Acres in two tracts to be Equally divided Between them the home place whereon I now live to fall to my son Thomas & the place whereon my son John now lives to fall to him by taking the down all tract in his part that lies by its self to them their heirs & assigns forever Item I give and bequeath unto my Eldest Son Saml Kennedy the sum of Twenty Dollars to be paid out of my Estate after my decease by my sons John & Thomas Equally Between them Item I Give & Bequeath unto my son Thomas Kennedy all my Farming Attensils & all my Stock of every description Also all my house hold & Kitchen furniture to him & his heirs forever. Item I Give and bequeath unto my Eldest Daughter Mary Chalfan the sum of four Dollars Item I Give & Bequeath unto my other four Daughters
