 County of Warrin and State of Kentucky being
 a reasonable State of Health and of sound and dispo-
 sition memory and understanding but being far
 advanced in life considering the certainty of
 death and the uncertainty of the time and being
 desirous of settling my worldly affairs and thus
 be better prepared to leave the world when it shall

 please god to call me hence Do therefore make and
 publish this ^{my} last will and testament in manner
 and form following, That is say First and Princi-
 pally I commit my soul into the hands of Almighty
 god and my body to the earth to be decently
 buried at discretion of my executor hereafter mentioned
 Secondly I will and bequeath to my loving wife
 Jane Helm six Negroes namely Beazar, Mack,
 Frank, Dover, Lucy, and Beck, five of my horse creatur
 is she taking. Her Schoise of all my stock of
 Horses and as much of all the residue of my stock
 as she may ~~think~~ ^{see} proper all my Farming utensils
 Howe held and Kitchen Furniture Waggon & gears
 and my house Plantation where on I now live
 that is to say all the cleared land on the east
 side of the Creek the orchard pasture garden all
 the houses now built and to make use of any
 timber or stone or any part of the of the land I
 now live on that she may see proper to take for
 the use of the place or for her own Consumption
 all of the above mentioned land & profits and emolu-
 ments arising therefrom to be by her freely enjoyed
 and disposed of during her natural life time and at
 her decease all the aforesaid negroes and their Increase
 all the Houses Stock of all kinds House hold and
 Kitchen furniture and waggon to be equally divided
 between my children namely John, Benjamin,
 George, Charles, Sally, Betia and Polly and their heirs
 in manner hereafter mentioned I also will and bequeath
 the balance of my negroes and stock be equally divided
 between the aforesaid children as hereafter mentioned
 2nd I will and bequeath to my son George Helm my
 home Plantation Including all this part of the 400
 Preemption 500 acre Treasury warrant adjoining
 on the north and 400 hundred acre on the West
 not sold or other wise disposed of after my own

and my wife Jane's death and it is my will that the said George move on the plantation and build at or near some spring on said place not nearer than one eighth of a mile from my house in which I now live and to have the use of ground for a garden at or near his house also to have the use of all the cleared land on the west side of the creek that now is or will be this year cultivated on the north side of a Branch towards Hardin Thomas for his use and benefit before our death and to clear as much land as he may think fit to clear for his use and the said George is not to molest the said Jane in any of her privileges on said land and it is my will and desire that the said George nor his heirs is not to have any other of my lands but is to take the above mentioned land as his part of all my other lands Thirdly I will and bequeath unto my son Benjamin Helm an equal part of my personal Estate and no more

Fourthly I will & bequeath unto my daughter Belia Hobbs 300 acres of land whereon they are now settled this land is to be valued as in its ^{improvement} state and the value of said land to be deducted out of her part of the out lands which shall fall to her share also I will & bequeath her an equal share of my personal estate &

Fifthly I will & bequeath unto my son Charles Helm one tract of land which I purchased for him valued at six hundred eighty five dollars & seven ty five cents which is to be deducted out of his part of the out lands that shall fall to his share also I will and bequeath him equal part of my personal estate then all the residue of my lands to be equally divided among my children namely John Charles, Sally, Belia, & Polly, & if they Land convey

to Charles Helm & Belia Hobbs be more than their proportionate parts of the Land the over plus is to be deducted from their parts of the personal estate It is my will and desire & I do appoint my wife Jane to be my executrix & my four sons namely John, Benjamin, George, and Charles to be my Executors of this my last will and testament hereby ratifying and confirming all other gifts & legacies given or bequeathed to any of my children not herein mentioned and I do hereby revoke cancel and make void all other wills heretofore made by me ratifying & confirming this & no other to be my last will & testament In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal
