Jones for the benefit and use of the children of the said John A. Jones the sum of four hundred and fifty Dollars in specie with interest thereon from the day on which she her heirs or assigns may take possession of the said Delia and her increase under and by virtue of this devise

Should I be entitled to any landed Estate or any other interest or estate whatsoever in the State of Maryland or elsewhere it is my will and desire that the same be equally divided between the children of my Brother John A. Jones and my sister Eleanor S. Ormsby or her children that is to say the children of John A.
