State of Kentucky being in low state of health, & perfectly  
sound in mind, bearing in mind the certainty of Death and  
the uncertainty of the time it may happen to have determined  
to make this my last Will and Settlement in manner

I give and bequeath to my surviving brothers and sisters  
at the time of my death all the Articles of Furnishings  
Draps and Bedclothes Trunks and Clothing together with  
any other Articles that I may leave at the house of my Father  
in Henderson County (Except One Silver Teapot One Silver  
Cream Pot Silver Sugar Tonge and Silver Spoons) to be  
equally divided among them the Articles of Silver Plate  
excepted above, I give to my Daughter Mary Ann Fisher  
and my said Daughter all before the arrival at the legal  
to make a Settlement here and in that event the said articles  
of Silver Plate is to be divided among my said brothers  
Sisters or such of them as may be alive together with all  
other property that may be legally disposed of by me  
real and personal. I do hereby nominate & constitute  
and appoint Daniel McKenney of Union County Kentucky  
Guardian to my said Daughter Mary Ann Fisher

in as full and ample a manner as any such appointment  
under such circumstances can be made and cause to be  
made to the immediate care of my said Daughter Mary  
Sister Daughter until the arrival at a proper age to be sent  
to school the proper time for which it requires when Guardian
