 The undersigned Commissioners appointed by an order of your
 Worshipful Court made at the August Term thereof for the year
 1835 to lay off the lower of Elizabeth A. Graves widow and relict of
 Adam R. Graves dec. in his lands beg. leave to report that being
 duly sworn they on 31st day of December 1835 went on the tract of
 lands in Henderson County in lot 1st 3d in Henderson & Co's Grant
 containing Two Hundred and Eighty five acres conveyed to the
 said Graves in his lifetime by deed from J. Dixon, and having
 fully examined the said lands and premises, have agreed and do
 attest to Mr. Graves as her dower as follows the following describe
 tract or parcel of land; containing ninety five acres and lands
 as follows to wit: Beginning at James Hicks most westwardly
 corner on the road to Madisonville and running North 62°
 West 63 poles to a maple and Hackberry on the side of the
 road, thence North 29° E 240 poles to a stake in the flat, thence
 S 52° E 63 poles to the North West corner of James Hicks tract
 thence with his line South 29° W 240 poles to the beginning
