

Charles Davis of the County of Harrison and State
of Kentucky, do hereby make my last will and Testament
in manner and form following (that is to say)
I do give and bequeath to my daughter
Mary H. Hamilton the negro boy named Nicholas a son
of mine and one negro woman named Mary to her and
her heirs forever. — I do give and bequeath to my son James
H. Davis the whole of my lands to which I have claim or
title together with the plantations whereon I now reside
with all the appurtenances thereto belonging to him and
his heirs forever. — Also I do give and bequeath to my said
son James H. Davis the following negroes to wit
Charles, Dick and Isaac. Also Lydia and her seven
children to wit Peggy, Sarah, Ralph, James, Hannah,
Cecilia and Ruth. And also a negro woman named
Mina to him and his heirs forever. — Also I give
and bequeath to my said son James H. Davis in horse
to wit Pompey, Bonner, Jimmy, Phipps, and Bragg. Also
together with all pure stock of neat cattle, sheep and hogs
and also my farming utensils and my household
and kitchen furniture (except so much as may be
necessary to dispose of hereafter) to him and his heirs
forever. And also I give and bequeath to my said son
James H. Davis all my money on hand together
with all my notes and Bonds that may be
due to me and also all my other debts due to me from
others. — I do give and bequeath to my daughter
Elizabeth Davis the following negroes to wit John
Faulstich and Charles, kids, John, Miss Dickson, Nancy
Duckey, Dan and Patsy and also boys and boys.
Children (namely) William, Richard, Jimmy and John.
Also a negro girl named Mariachi with an old woman
named Kate to her and her heirs forever. — I also give
and bequeath to my said daughter Elizabeth Davis a certain
two year old Brown horse colt and also two head and
quarters and a Bureau to her and her heirs forever.
— I do give and bequeath to my Grand daughter Elizabeth
Hamilton the whole of her and her heirs forever.
— I do give and bequeath to my son in law Fayette Davis

One negro Girl named Polly and one bright
bay two year old colt to him and to his heirs forever.
— I give and bequeath to my Grand son Charles
Davis one certain negro boy named Charles to him
and his heirs forever. But the said boy Charles is to remain
in the possession of my son James H. Davis until he
is sixteen years of age then my said son James is
to bind him to learn the Blacksmith trade for the term of
five years and when he has finished his apprenticeship
then he shall be put into the possession of my said Grand
son Charles Davis. — I do give and bequeath to
my Grandson Edward Davis one certain negro boy
named Tom to him and his heirs forever.
— Also it is my wish and desire that my daughter
Mary H. Hamilton should be permitted to live
reside with her family where she now resides on
the plantation where my son Edward formerly
lived together with free use of all the lands lying
on the west side of the lower branch of River creek
so long as she may think proper to reside thereon.
But should my said daughter Mary H. Hamilton
think proper to remove from said plantation then
in that case she shall not be entitled to any further
enjoyment of the same and whole use and enjoyment
of the same shall be vested in my said son James
as expressed in the third item of this will.
— It is also my further wish and desire that no
Executor herein after named should have full power
to convey by Deed any lands to any person that
would be found in law or equity to convey even
if living. — And lastly. — I do hereby appoint my
son James H. Davis and my friend Daniel McBride
Executors of this my last will and Testament, hereby
revoking all other or former wills or Testaments that
I have before made. In witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 20th
day of September 1800. Charles Davis

I do add to my foregoing last will and testament
I give and bequeath to my son Samuel H Davis a Negro
named Henry Clinton to him and his heirs forever.
Also I give and bequeath to my said son Samuel H
Davis all my property of whatever kind it may be
whether real or personal that has not been otherwise dis-
posed of in the foregoing will. In Testimony whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal
this 3rd day of September 1822.

In the name of God Amen. I James Williams of
Henderson County and State of Kentucky, Being of sound
and perfect mind and memory Calling to mind the
uncertainty of this transitory life, do make and ordain
this my last will and Testament in manner and as
following as to my worldly Estate wherewith Almighty
God hath blessed me. I give and dispose in manner here-
following. I give and bequeath unto my son James
Williams Ten Dollars lawful money of Kentucky. I
give unto his lawful heirs One hundred and ten
Dollars lawful money of Kentucky.
I then I give unto my son William Williams Five
Dollars lawful money of Kentucky. Also I give unto
his lawful heirs Forty five Dollars lawful money.

the State of Tennessee I give unto my son Robert Williams
my Negro named Chance. Also I give my Negro named
Cecilia to his lawful heirs and if my son Robert should
die before of this said Cecilia, he is to furnish a young and
likely Negro woman and child in place of him to his
lawful heirs. Also I give my son Robert my Black
Smith tools. Also I give unto his lawful heirs my cows
her increase from the ^{that} now in his possession.
I then I give unto my daughter Mary Ann my Negro
woman named and all her increase. Also I leave my
cattle and my Negro Girl Cecilia her children at
her death to my Grand daughter Elizabeth Jones and
Also I give my Grand daughter Mary Ann Jones my
bed at my death. I then I give unto my son Samuel
Williams my Negro woman named and her increase
his life time and at his death to his wife her life
time or in default here to be equally divided
among his lawful heirs. Also I leave my son Samuel
my Negro boy named and to my Grand son James
son Augustus Williams. Comes to the year of twenty
five years of age and then to be my Grand son
James son Augustus Williams. Also I leave my son
son James son Augustus Williams and his lawful
Mother my Cecilia at my death. Also I give unto
my son Samuel Williams Children my cows and
her increase from this to be equally divided
them. Also I give my Negro woman Ann to my
daughter Lucy Jones and my son Samuel Williams
and their heirs after paying my son James and
Williams Williams Children Ten hundred and fifty
Dollars as above mentioned, likewise my will
that the residue of my Estate be equally divided be-
tween my son Samuel Williams and my daughter
Lucy Jones at my death, to be equally divided
between them and I appoint my son Samuel & Robert
Williams and Henry Jones Executors to this my last
will and Testament wherein I have hereunto set my hand
and seal this 9th day of August in the year of 1822.
