2^d I will and bequeath unto my brother John Berry my tract of land I purchased from Willoughby Powell situated in Henderson County on the waters of Beaver Dam for his life and benefit forever.

3^d I will and bequeath unto my niece Elizabeth Mammack daughter of Enoch Berry deceased my bed and all my bed furniture all my bureau now in the possession of Lazarus Powell.

4th I will and bequeath to George Berry son of my brother Enoch Berry deceased all of my money that is coming to me either from the public or from private persons except so much as it may demand to pay all my just debts and demands against me.

5th I will and bequeath to my nephew James M. Berry son of Enoch Berry deceased and unto my niece Sarah Simons daughter of Robert Ferguson deceased all my lands if obtained from the public for my services in the revolutionary War to be equally divided between them after deducting the expenses in procuring it. And I hereby constitute and appoint my loving friends James M. Berry and James M. Berry my sole executor to this my last will and Testament and hereby revoking all other wills and acknowledging this and no other to be my last will and Testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this fourth day of October One thousand Eight hundred and twenty three.

I also will and bequeath to Samuel four negroes namely Ned, Jude, Tom and Jim to have and to hold during his natural life and then to revert to his children if he should have any but if he should die without issue they are to be to revert to the children of Thomas H. Berry deceased.

I also will and bequeath to Samuel three head of Horses and one head of cattle.

Thirdly - I will and bequeath to Catharine Wilson my daughter one hundred acres of land to be surveyed and taken off of the water and surface of my tract of land she also four head of cattle.

Fourthly - I will and bequeath to my brother John's son John one horse and one black horse seven years old next spring. I also will one black horse to his son Isaac also one young bay mare to his son Enoch the residue of my property not herein mentioned and appropriated shall be sold at twelve months credit to the highest bidder.

I also will that all my just debts shall be discharged out of the money arising from the sale of my property.

I also will that all the money remaining from the sale of my property and all monies that shall be left as a remainder after the settlement of all my just debts shall descend to my grand children to be equally divided between them. Lastly I appoint Samuel H. Berry as my Executor to this my last will and Testament revoking all other higher sales and delivered in presence of us this 18th day of January 1838. The foregoing bequest to my two daughters Elizabeth and Catharine of a quarter section of land each it is to be understood is to be completed to them by my son John having given the plantation and land on which I live as an equivalent.
