In the name of God I Ann Lashell Jones being sound of mind and desirous of disposing of my property among my relations during my life do hereby ordain declare and publish the following writing as my last will and Testament.

I devise to my sister Eleanor Smith Ormsby one negro boy Hamilton a negro girl Harriet, and a negro girl called Emily also a negro girl called Louisa to her and her heirs forever and also to Eleanor Smith Ormsby a negro woman named Esther

I also bequeath to my sister Eleanor Smith Ormsby her heirs and assigns forever one negro girl called Delia and her increase forever (whether the children the said Delia may have been born

before or after my death the same to belong to Eleanor Smith Ormsby her heirs &c) But this bequest is made upon the condition nevertheless that the said Eleanor Smith Ormsby is to pay within four years after my death or at soon thereafter as may be convenient for her to my brother John A. Jones for the benefit and use of the children of the said John A. Jones the sum of four hundred and fifty Dollars in specie with interest thereon from the day on which she her heirs or assigns may take possession of the said Delia and her increase under and by virtue of this devise

Should I be entitled to any landed Estate or any other interest or estate whatsoever in the State of Maryland or elsewhere it is my will and desire that the same be equally divided between the children of my Brother John A. Jones and my sister Eleanor S. Ormsby or her children that is to say the children of John A. Jones to receive one moiety and the said Eleanor Smith Ormsby or her children one moiety It is furthermore my will and desire that if I should outlive my latter sister that then the bequest herein made to her shall be deemed and taken as if made to her children In witness of all which I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 5th day of January in the year 1823

George Perry of Henderson County and State of Kentucky being in a weak state of health but perfect mind and memory but calling to mind it is appropriate for all men once to die do hereby constitute and ordain this and no other my last will and Testament first I will and bequeath my soul to God who gave it and my body to the earth from whence it was taken to be buried in a Christian like manner as to my worldly property it is my will and desire it shall be disposed of in the

187 following manner - 1st It is my will and desire that all my just debts be paid.

2^d I will and bequeath unto my brother John Berry my tract of land I purchased from Willoughby Powell situated in Henderson County on the waters of Beaver Dam for his life and benefit forever.

3^d I will and bequeath unto my niece Elizabeth Mammack daughter of Enock Berry deceased my bed and all my bed furniture all my bureau now in the possession of Lazarus Powell.

4th I will and bequeath to George Berry son of my brother Enock Berry deceased all of my money that is coming to me either from the public or from private persons except so much as it may demand to pay all my just debts and demands against me.

5th I will and bequeath to my nephew James M. Berry son of Enock Berry deceased and unto my niece Sarah Simons daughter of Robert Ferguson deceased all my lands if obtained from the public for my services in the revolutionary War to be equally divided between them after deducting the expenses in procuring it. And I hereby constitute and appoint my loving friends James M. Berry and James M. Berry my sole executor to this my last will and Testament and hereby revoking all other wills and acknowledging this and no other to be my last will and Testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this fourth day of October One thousand Eight hundred and twenty three.

my will and desire that all my just debts be paid. I have pleased God to keep me on this life I give hence and dispose of in the following manner and form.

First - I give and bequeath to my dearly beloved wife one third of my estate both real and personal during her natural life, and then to descend to my Brother Jonas's children after her death.

Secondly - I will and bequeath to my Son Saml. H. Berry two hundred acres of land to be selected and chosen by himself after his mother's taking her third. I also will and bequeath to Samuel four negroes namely Ned, Jude, Tom, and Jim to have and to hold during his natural life, and then to revert to his children if he should have any, but if he should die without issue they are to revert to the children of Thomas Hicks deceased.

I also will and bequeath to Samuel three head of Horses and one head of cattle.

Thirdly - I will and bequeath to Catharine Wilson my daughter one hundred acres of land to be surveyed and taken off of the water and surface of my tract of land she also has head of cattle.

Fourthly - I will and bequeath to my brother John's son John one horse and one black horse seven years old next spring. I also will one black horse to his son Isaac also one young bay mare to his son Enock the residue of my property not herein mentioned and appropriated shall be sold at twelve months credit to the highest bidder.

I also will that all my just debts shall be discharged out of the money arising from the sale of my property.

I also will that all the money remaining from the sale of my property and all monies that shall be left as a remainder after the settlement of all my just debts shall descend to my grand children to be equally divided between them. Lastly I appoint Samuel H. Berry as my Executor to this my last will and Testament revoking all other higher sales and delivered in presence of us this 18th day of January 1834. The seal and interline a consent to before signed.
