The undersigned Commissioners did meet on the premises
on the day of May 1837 as above written and proceeded
to divide said tract of land equally, allotting 1st to the

heirs of Aaron Mellon dec'd, and 1st to John Hunter, and do
say to the best of our judgment that lot 1st is worth that dollars
more than lot 2nd. The Boundary of said lots is as follows to wit
Lot 1st Beginning at a double black oak and post oak -
Spencers corner, running North 182 to a Stake John H. Mullins
corner, thence with his line N. 87° W. 115 poles to three oaks in the
Normans line - thence South 179 poles to a Hickory, Post oak,
& Black gum in Spencers line - thence with his line to the beginning
containing 128 acres - Lot 2nd Beginning at Aaron
Mellons heirs corner 3 oaks in Normans line running North
Normans line S. 87° W. 99 poles to two Hickories this corner
in Sellers line, thence with Sellers line S. 10° E. 98 poles to a
