In obedience to the within order from the County Court of Henderson County and directed by Lazarus Powell Charles M Allen and William Williams after first being sworn duly proceeded to allot the late Nancy Bruce's Power of Asa Turner deceased's Estate as follows One Negro Woman named Celine One Negro boy named John One Negro Girl named Louisa as being in part of the Negro property and then proceeded to allot her Power of land including the mansion House as full out Beginning at a small Honey Locust & small Walnut thence South 61° E 83° 30' to a State thence South

29° N 10 1/2° W to popular dogwood & black Oak thence North 29° East 61° W 83° 30' to two hickories and Oak thence North 29° East 61° W to the Beginning containing by estimation fifty five acres but the greater part of this fifty five acres being improved land we proceeded to lay off nearly five acres adjoining of Woodland as follows Beginning at a Honey Locust and Saplings thence running N 61° W 83° 30' to an ash & black Oak thence South 29° East 61° W 83° 30' to a State in said line thence S 29° E 80° 30' to the Beginning containing by Estimation 90 acres And agreeably to the within Order of the within of this County Court aforesaid we then proceeded to settle with William S. Pol the dowry of Asa Turner deceased and upon a settlement with said Pol we find from the evidence and vouchers received that he William S. Pol doth as aforesaid indebted to the Estate of Asa Turner deceased One Hundred and Sixty eight Dollars & forty nine Cents and upon an examination of his papers we find that Richard M Bruce the husband of said Nancy Bruce became indebted to the children or their Guardian (Robert Smith) One Hundred and eighty Dollars Seventeen & one third Cents In Witness Whereof we as named above have hereunto set our hands this day and date above

It is remembered that I Ann Fisher of the County of Union and
State of Kentucky being in low state of health the defect of
sound mind bearing in mind the certainty of death and
the uncertainty of the time it may happen have determined
to make this my last Will and Testament in manner
and form as follows that is to say

I Give and bequeath to my surviving brothers and sisters
at the time of my death all the Articles of Furniture
Dress and Dress Cloth Trunks and Clothing together with
any other Articles that I may have at the death of my Father
in Anderson County (except one Silver Tea set and Silver
Cream pot Silver Sugar Tongs and Silver Spoons) to be
equally divided among them the Articles of Silver Plate
excepted above, I give to my Daughter Mary Ann Fisher
and my said Daughter dies before she arrives at the legal
age to make a Testament then and in that event the said Articles
of Silver Plate to be divided among my said brothers
Sisters or such of them as may be alive together with any
other property that may be legally disposed of by me
read and perused. I do hereby nominate constitute
and appoint Daniel H. Kenny of Union County Kentucky
Guardian to my said Daughter Mary Ann Fisher

in as full and ample a manner as any such appointment
under such circumstances can be made and lastly I Com-
mand to the immediate care of my sister Betty Fisher my
said Daughter until she arrives at a proper age to be put
to school the proper time for which is expressed above
In Witness Whereof I hereunto set my hand and seal
the 30th day of August in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand
and Eight Hundred and Twenty Five

I Give and bequeath to my dear wife Prudence to dispose
of as she pleases the following species of property (viz) two Negro
Boys named big John and little John and two Negro women
Jane and Polly and perhaps two or three children named Martha
and Mary and the plantation on which I now live farming
nutrients all my stock of every kind household & kitchen
furniture
