

In the name of God Amen I Hugh Tate of Henderson County and the
 of Kentucky being weak and sick in body but of sound mind and
 disposing memory (for which I thank God) and calling to mind the
 uncertainty of human life and being desirous to dispose of all
 such worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with
 I give and bequeath the same in manner and form following
 that is to say

I give to my son John Tate a tract of land containing six acres
 it being a part of four hundred acres sold Robert Eades by Thos. J.
 and Thomas Polley Attorneys in fact for Gen. Thomas Polley which
 said land was conveyed by said Attorney to the said Robert Eades
 who gave his bond to reconvey it any time when called upon which
 bond has been offered to me. I desired the land above described
 to be conveyed to my above named son John Tate

Then I give to my daughter Nancy Tate her for and as an appurtenance
 forever a Negro woman named Susan and her daughter Pats a
 man named Jefferson two beds and furniture a bureau that stands
 in her room one lit silver spoons and candle twenty head of cattle
 seven head of hogs two black mares two two years old one year old
 and a two year old colts one a dam the other a boy It is also my will
 and desire that my two sons Andrew Tate and Hugh Tate take care
 of and provide my said daughter Nancy with a comfortable room
 and furnish her with all such articles as may be necessary for comfortable
 living as long as she may think proper to remain with them

Then I give to my son James Tate a two year old black colts

Then I give to my son Andrew Tate my clock

All the rest of my Estate of any kind and personal of what nature or
 kind soever it may be not herein particularly disposed of consisting
 of lands household and kitchen furniture Negroes cattle hogs sheep
 books and farming utensils of every description also all
 debts due me I give to my two sons Andrew Tate and Hugh Tate
 to be equally divided between them which I give to them their heirs
 Executors administrators and assigns forever It is also my desire that
 my sons Andrew Tate and Hugh Tate pay all my just debts

And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my son Andrew Tate
 and Hugh Tate Executors of this my last Will and Testament hereby
 revoking all other or former Wills or Testaments by me heretofore made
 in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed
 my seal this 14th day of June in the year of our Lord

It is known to all whom it may concern that I Enos H. Callister being
 weak in body but sound in mind and recollection considering the
 uncertainty of life and liability to death do make this my last Will
 and Testament revoking all others of whatsoever tenor or date

In the first place it is my will and desire that my beloved wife
 Jane H. Callister shall have own and hold in her possession the
 plantation I now live on with all the Negroes Horses and stock
 of every kind together with the farming utensils household and
 kitchen furniture except so much as I may hereafter bequeath
 to my children

In the second place it is my will and desire that my son John
 H. Callister shall own and hold the plantation he is now in possession
 of adjoining Alfred Hills land together with the Horses and stock
 that he now claims

In the third place I bequeath to my son Samuel H. Callister the
 land he is in possession of adjoining Arthur Jordan land
 together with the Horses and stock that he now claims

In the fourth place I bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Ann H. Callister
 my quarter section of land adjoining Joseph H. Callister's plantation
 together with all the Horses she now claims

In the fifth place I bequeath to my daughter Lucretia H. Callister my
 two hundred acres of land on the waters of canoe creek adjoining
 George Hanes's land and also six acres on the head
 of Green River land together with the Horses she now claims
