Edmund Hopkins, Horatio H. Guatkins, and John D. Anderson appeared before the undersigned one of the Justices of the peace for Summers County and made oath that the within appraisement of the estate of Robert is true. Given under my hand this 25th Nov 1820.

last will

In the name of God Amen. I Isaac Sumner of the County of Summers and State of Kentucky do constitute this my last will and Testament making all others void. I give to my beloved wife Nancy Sumner the following negroes: Saps, Mordecai, Matilda, Caroline, Mary Ann and Sady, which is to be entirely at her disposal during her life time which property after her death shall be disposed of in the following manner. - I give my Thomas to Sumner a negro man by the name of Mordecai. - I give to my daughter Lemina Cosby, a negro girl named Anne and fifty Dollars. - I give to my son Thomas & Sumner in trust for my daughter Nancy Jones a negro woman named Ann and her increase, also a negro girl named Mary Ann and a negro boy named Jerry during her life and after her death to her heirs lawfully begotten of her body. - I give to my daughter Nancy Jones my share in the following manner: to run a straight line beginning at a dogwood and black oak marked on a line being line between myself and Reuben Collier from by my end and Lumber to a marked oak and post oak on the dividing line between myself and John P. P. P. formerly myself and Richard Hart and Thomas & Sumner to have the north end of said land. - I give to my son Thomas & Sumner in trust for my daughter Nancy Jones the south during her life and after her death to her son Sumner Jones. - I give to my beloved wife Nancy Sumner a negro man named Saps and a negro girl named Caroline to will and dispose of in any manner she may think proper, also she is to have use of the plantation during her life. - I give to my son Thomas & Sumner should have all my stock and all my household and kitchen furniture and plantation tools during her life and after her death to be equally divided between my children to wit: Thomas & Sumner, Lemina Cosby and Thomas & Sumner in trust for Nancy Jones. - I give to my grandson Isaac Cosby one fourth part and furniture. - I give to my grandson Sumner Jones one fourth part and furniture. - I give to my son Thomas & Sumner and Richard Cosby my Executors to this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this day of May 1820.
