Commiss^{rs} to an Order of the County Court to us directed we the undersigned Commissioners proceeded after being duly sworn to lay off and apportion to Eleanor Dugan the out of Nathaniel Dugan claimed her share in said Estate and to divide the remainder between the leg^s of said Dugan deceased as follows. Beginning at the corner of the lot of said Dugan to include the same in the beginning at a Sugar tree (black gum) which is 1100 North 29 East 95 poles to a white Oak and ash. Thence North 61 East 80 poles to a hickory at the spring. Thence South 29 West 95 poles to a black Oak. Thence South 61 East 80 poles to the beginning containing by survey 51 acres as being his part of the original tract. Also his part of the tract of land beginning at the Sugar tree and Sugarwood running North 61 West 80 poles to the corner of the black gum thence South 29 West 84 and three tenths poles to a stake thence South 61 East 80 poles to a white Oak. Thence South 29 East 84 3/4 poles to the beginning containing by estimation nineteen acres as being her share in the land. For then by consent of the leg^s at which time a certain negro man named Tom & one woman named Jane and these two negroes being more than her kind the said Dugan paid to the leg^s the amount of one hundred and one dollars and six cents in notes on the Estate also then there in all the balance of the estate. Then proceeded a lot to the leg^s their share in said Estate as follows. (Dr. William Williams) 30 acres beginning at a white Walnut & Poplar thence running South 29 West 64 poles to a Poplar thence South 61 East 58 poles to two Walnuts and Poplar thence North 29 East 64 poles to a stake thence North 61 West 58 poles to the beginning as being his part of the original tract. Also his part in another tract beginning at a white Walnut and Poplar running South 61 East 29 1/2 poles to a white Walnut & Sugar tree thence North 29 East 110 poles to a Poplar thence South 29 West 111 poles to the beginning by survey 100 acres. Then by survey 100 acres all his proportion in the negroes party (Tom) one Negro man named Jack and nineteen dollars and thirty eight and a half cents in notes as being his part of the Estate. For then proceeded to also to Humphrey David's part of the Estate (cont. 35 1/2 acres in the original tract. Beginning at a white Oak thence running North 61 West 89 poles to a stake thence South 29 West 64 poles to two Walnuts & Poplar thence South 61 East 89 poles to a stake thence North 29 East 64 poles to the beginning also his part in another tract. Beginning at the Sugar tree & black gum thence running South 29 West 84 3/4
