From the above distribution it will be perceived by the Court that \$955 are each legatee's interest in the above sum of \$1775 - and that Sarah, Mary and Matilda are indebted to the other two legatees - Sarah in the sum of \$45, Mary in the sum of \$45, and Matilda in the sum of \$20 - The Comrs. can not conclude without offering an apology to the Court for their failure in reporting as per Order directed, that is to their family term - Circumstances, however, in the opinion of the Comrs. justified the delay - They committed an error, as they conceived, in reference to the division, which, it seemed desirable, should be corrected, and which could not be done in time to report to the last Court - That error is now corrected and we hope to the advantage and best interest of the heirs - We are now satisfied with our delay, the legatees are satisfied, and we hope the Court will be satisfied.
