and perfect mind and memory calling to mind the
uncertainty of this transitory life, do make and ordain
this my last will and Testament in manner and as
following as to my worldly Estate wherein Almighty
God hath blessed me. I give and dispose in manner here-
following. I give and bequeath unto my son James
Williams Ten Dollars lawful money of Kentucky. I
give unto his lawful heirs One hundred and ten
Dollars lawful money of Kentucky.
I then I give unto my son William Williams Five
Dollars lawful money of Kentucky. Also I give unto
his lawful heirs Forty five Dollars lawful money.

the whole I then I give unto my son Robert Williams
my Negro named Chance. Also I give my Negro named
Cecilia to his lawful heirs and if my son Robert should
die before of this said Cecilia, he is to furnish a young and
likely Negro woman and child in place of him to his
lawful heirs. Also I give my son Robert my Black
Smiths tools. Also I give unto his lawful heirs my cows
her increase from the ^{that} is now in his possession.
I then I give unto my daughter Mary Jane my Negro
woman named and all her increase. Also I then my
daughter Mary my Negro Girl Cecilia her clothing at
her death to my Grand daughter Elizabeth Jones. and
Also I give my Grand daughter Mary Will Jones my
bed at her death. I then I give unto my son Samuel
Williams my Negro woman Elizabeth and her increase
his life time and at his death to his wife her life
time or in case she dies to be equally divided
among his lawful heirs. Also I give my son Samuel
my Negro boy James and to my Grand son James
son Augustus Williams. Comes to the year of twenty
five years of age and then to be my Grand son
James son Augustus Williams. Also I give my son
son James son Augustus Williams and his lawful
Mother my Cecilia at my death. Also I give unto
my son Samuel Williams Children my cows and
her increase from this to be equally divided
I then. Also I give my Negro woman Ruth to my
daughter Lucy Jones and my son Samuel Williams
and their heirs after paying my son James and
Williams Williams Children Ten hundred and fifty
Dollars as above mentioned, likewise my will
that the residue of my Estate be equally divided be-
tween my son Samuel Williams and my daughter
Lucy Jones at my death, to be equally divided
between them and I appoint my son Samuel & Robert
Williams and Henry Jones Executors to this my last
will and Testament wherein I have hereunto set my hand
and seal this 9th day of August in the year of 1822.

Whereas James Williams late of Henderson County, hath departed this life having first made and published his last will and Testament in writing bearing date the 5th day of August 1822, which is hereto annexed and whereas Mary late a subscribing Witness thereto cannot conveniently travel to the County Court of Henderson County, Tennessee. We command you that at some convenient place and place by you to be appointed you call and cause the said Mary late the Witness aforesaid to come before you and her deponently examine on the holy Evangelists of Almighty God whether the said Testator signed and made and executed the same as and for his last will and Testament in her presence and whether the said Testator was of sound mind and disposing memory at the time of the signing thereof and her examinations aforesaid being taken, that you distinctly and fully without delay send and certify to us enclosed, sending us also the will, Witness H. H. Grigsby Clerk of our said Court at the Courthouse the 5th day of August 1822 and in the 2^d year of the Commonwealth. H. H. Grigsby Clerk State of Tennessee
