The Undersigned Commissioners appointed by order of the County Court to divide the estate of Benjamin Faulkner deceased have the honor to report the following facts to the Court and to submit the same as their report -
They valued the negroes that were shown to them as follows:
Buck 49 years old to \$270. Lucinda 13 years old 275
John 50 years old to 75 Matilda 8 250
Bob 24 years old to 406 Charlotte 9 200
Sharpe 43 or so 300 Fanny 7 160
Violet 31 or infant, Henry 350 John 5 150
amounting in the whole to \$2436.

Which divided into 6 shares making them as nearly in value to \$406. the 1/6 of the sum total as we shall, and allotted them to the heirs by drawing lots as follows: To Nancy, 1800 value to \$406. - To Mary, Buck \$270. John \$150 making \$420, being an excess of \$14. which she is to pay Ben - To Benjamin Faulkner we allotted old John \$75 & Lucinda \$275 - \$14 from Mary and forty two dollars from Eliza making his full share \$406.
To William Faulkner we allotted Sharpe \$300. Fanny \$160 making \$460 being an excess of \$54 which he is to pay to Sally - To Sally, we allotted Violet & child \$350.
