valued to six hundred and fifty Dollars it being the best land and one hundred and twenty five acres including the old mansion House & Barns etc we valued at four hundred dollars and Hiram we decreed the pay to Bursheba one hundred and twenty five dollars making the equal at her becoming of age at the lawful interest from this date the testimony whereof we Lazarus Powell William Williams Charles W. Allen and Baxter S. Chatham have hereunto set our hands this 11th day of January 1836
