

for Saml. W. Wardlow & 1880 and for Mary b. & Ann Eliza each & 1480 and Saml. W. Wardlow to be charged from the period of 25th Oct 1819 to this time (23rd Feb 1829) for boarding clothing, tuition, physicians, expenses, &c. at the rate of \$150. per annum making the sum of \$1380.

And Mary b. Wardlow to be charged for the same period at the rate of \$130 per annum making the sum of \$1313.

And Ann Eliza Wardlow to be charged for the same period at the rate of \$120 per annum making the sum of \$1224. which would leave a balance of the profit of the estate due to Mary b. Wardlow of \$2. and to Ann Eliza Wardlow the sum of \$256.

The undersigned Commissioners appointed by order of the Court to allot the Estate of Mr. Lucy B. Jones late Wardlow in the hands of her said deceased husband, and to divide the profits due of the same among the heirs of the said James b. Wardlow have discharged their duty as follows. They allotted to W. I. B. Jones the negroes, on Judy, Nancy, actaries and Bush valued by them at \$1350. To Samuel Wardlow the negroes Tom, Anne and Susan valued at \$875. To Mary Wardlow the negroes Richard, Harriet, Betty, and Georgiana valued by them at \$925. and to Ann Eliza Wardlow the negroes George, Jenny Burwell, and James valued by them at \$750. their valuations tho not exactly equal one or more to as they could be made and that Mary b. Wardlow pay to Sam Williams \$875 and that Ann Eliza pay to him \$33.75. to make all their portions equal. all which is respectfully submitted.

In the name of God Amen I John Hart of the County of Harrison and State of Kentucky do ordain this my last Will and Testament according to all others

Item 1st I give to my wife Patience Hart the following negroes Prince, Signal, Bear, Squire, & Lucy which is to be entirely at her disposal during her life time. Which property after her death shall be disposed of in the following manner Lucy and her sacres to be equally divided between Rhoda Hart and Polly Hart. Bear & Squire to be equally divided between Thomas Hart and John Hart.

Item 2^d I give to my son Thomas Hart a negro Boy named Martin

Item 3^d I give to my son John Hart a negro Boy named Hayden and a Bed and furniture.

Item 4th I give to my daughter Rebecca Hart a negro Girl named Harriet with a Bed and furniture

Item 5th I give to my daughter Polly Hart a negro Girl named Hannah with a Bed and furniture with a good saddle

Item 6th I give to my daughter Polly Hart a negro Girl named Melinda with a Bed and furniture and good saddle

Item 7th I give to my daughter Susanon Hays one negro Girl named Eliza a Bed and furniture and saddle which is already in her possession

Item 8th I give to my two Grand sons John H. Standley and Nathaniel S. Standley two negroes named Bartlett and Luggy which negroes I purchased with their money and is to be taken in place of their money when they arrive of full age.

Item 9th I give to my daughter Nancy Jordan a negro Boy Shelby in addition to what I have already given her

Item 10th I give to my daughter Elizabeth Sugg a negro Boy named Prince - Edward on her paying to Lucy Standley a balance due from me to her of about thirty Dollars

Item 11th I desire all my stock of every kind with the plantation tools kitchen furniture with the plantation to remain in possession of my wife Patience Hart her life time then it is to be entirely at her disposal

Item 12th After the death of my wife Patience Hart I desire my land to be divided in the following manner To run a line from the creek through the centre of the land and Thomas Hart to have the south end and John J. Hart the other half.

Item 13th I give all claims and interest to a legacy which is coming to me after the death of my brother Samuel Hart to my two sons Thomas Hart and John Hart and their heirs

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I do hereby appoint my two sons Thomas Hart and John J. Hart my Executors to this my last will and Testament in witness whereof I have set my hand and seal this 29th day of June 1821

In the name of God I Ann Lashell Jones being sound of mind and desirous of disposing of my property among my relations during my life do hereby ordain declare and publish the following writing as my last will and Testament.

I devise to my sister Eleanor Smith Ormsby one negro boy Hamilton a negro girl Harriet, and a negro girl called Emily also a negro girl called Louisa to her and her heirs forever and also to Eleanor Smith Ormsby a negro woman named Esther

I also bequeath to my sister Eleanor Smith Ormsby her heirs and assigns forever one negro girl called Delia and her increase forever (whether the children the said Delia may have been born

before or after my death the same to belong to Eleanor Smith Ormsby her heirs &c) But this bequest is made upon the condition nevertheless that the said Eleanor Smith Ormsby is to pay within four years after my death or at soon thereafter as may be convenient for her to my brother John A. Jones for the benefit and use of the children of the said John A. Jones the sum of four hundred and fifty Dollars in specie with interest thereon from the day on which she her heirs or assigns may take possession of the said Delia and her increase under and by virtue of this devise

Should I be entitled to any landed Estate or any other interest or estate whatsoever in the State of Maryland or elsewhere it is my will and desire that the same be equally divided between the children of my Brother John A. Jones and my sister Eleanor S. Ormsby or her children that is to say the children of John A. Jones to receive one moiety and the said Eleanor Smith Ormsby or her children one moiety It is furthermore my will and desire that if I should outlive my last wife that then the bequest herein made to her shall be deemed and taken as if made to her children In witness of all which I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 5th day of January in the year 1823
