Know all men by this presents that I Elizabeth Nagley of the County and State aforesaid, feeling the infirmity of age and calling to mind the uncertainty of life and that it is appointed to all persons once to die, do make this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all other Wills, being in sound mind and memory do hereby dispose of worldly goods, which it hath it hath pleased almighty God to bless me, in the following manner To wit

I give and bequeath unto my son David Nagley two hundred and twelve Dollars which sum he the said David hath already received. to him and his heirs forever

I give and bequeath to my son George Nagley all and singular the property included in a Deed of Gift which I now hold or him amounting to four hundred and fifty Dollars to him and his heirs forever

I give and bequeath to the children of George Nagley and Nancy his wife my bureau bed and furniture and all other of my household furniture to them and their heirs forever having heretofore given my other children what I designed

I desire that all my personal property be sold at such times and on such credits as my Executor hereon after named may think most advantageous

I also wish my said Executor to make such application of the money that may be collected on the notes assigned to James Alford for the benefit of my children amounting to the sum of Dollars more or less as to him may appear most for their interest either in the purchase of property for them or otherwise

It is also my desire that my said Executor have full power to collect all debts due me to collect bills all accounts and pay debts to effect compromise of claims and to superintend the management of my business generally to procure and employ a manager for my farms & Negroes so long as they can be legally and profitably retained for the benefit of my estate and I hereby vest my said Executor with all power and authority which I can give and he can legally execute at such

It is my desire that after the payment of all my just debts whatever of property or money may remain shall be equally divided among my children and that my wife shall have the right privilege of possession of the mansion house of farm. My Executor is also required and authorized to furnish my said wife with such reasonable supplies of money or whatever ^{can} be necessary for her comfortable support so long as any of the property of the estate may remain in his hands as Executor And lastly I appoint my friend James Alford Executor of this my last Will and Testament or in case of his death or failure to act as such I then appoint my friends Thomas Fowler as my Executor It is my express desire that whichever of the two named as Executors may qualify may not be required to give security at such In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 11th day of August 1838
