I Woody Thomas of the County of Hancock State of Maine being weak in body but of perfectly sound disposing mind memory & understanding this my last will and Testament hereby bequeath and assign my soul to God, and my body to the care to be buried in a decent Christian manner.

Secondly, I will and ordain that my personal estate now in possession be converted into money, and the whole after my funeral charges and last debts are discharged be paid to my dear sister Elizabeth Dow of the County of Gloucester to whom I give and bequeath all my estate real and personal. But in the event of her decease before her will is executed my desire and decree is that all my estate be equally divided between my two sisters Elizabeth Dow and Ruth Hale. Thirdly, I hereby appoint Daniel Barker and Eliza Barker of the County of Gloucester Executors of this my last will and Testament. On testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal at Brunswick Maine this 24 day of August 1822.

I am my desire is that there shall be neither alienation nor sale of my property real or above mentioned and that it may be kept together under the direction of my living wife Sarah during her life, and if she make any alienation among my children that a memorandum be kept of the amount and produced at the final settlement among them. And also my desire that all my property both real and personal at the death of my loving wife be equally divided between my sons Gabriel & Harrison & Daniel & Harrison and my daughter Francis B. Mason and Lucy R. Harrison and their heirs forever and in default of issue in my daughter the property herein given to return at their deaths to my sons Gabriel & Francis B. as it is understood that the property I have advanced to my daughter Francis is to be accounted for at its value at the time it was received, lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint my loving wife Sarah and my son Richard Barbra of Jefferson County Executor of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made and declaring this to be my last in writing whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 24 day of March 1825.
