Agreeably to an Order of the County Court to us directed we the undersigned Commissioners proceeded after being duly sworn to lay off and apportion to Oliver Benson the out of Nathaniel Benson claimed her share in said Estate and to divide the remainder between the leg & heirs of said Benson deceased as follows by running off said Widow's Part in the 1 place to ad to include the same in the beginning at a Sugar tree plantation which is 1/2 mile North 29 East 9 5 poles to a white Oak and ash. Hence North 61 East 80 poles to a hickory at the spring. Hence South 29 West 9 5 poles to a black Oak. Hence South 61 East 80 poles to the beginning containing by survey 51 acres as being his part of the original tract all his part of the same tract of land beginning at the Sugar tree and Sugar tree running North 61 East 80 poles to the Sugar tree. Black Gum trees South 29 West 64 and three knots poles to a stake hence South 61 East 80 poles to a white Oak. Hence South 29 East 80 1/2 poles to the beginning containing by estimation nineteen acres as being her share in the land.
