Knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, being in perfect mind and memory, I make this my last Will and Testament in the year of Our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Ninety six, first I bequeath my soul to God from whence it came, my body to the earth to be buried in a Christian like manner and as touching my worldly affairs of to all my Just Debts being paid, I Will and bequeath my Negro boy George to my Son Benjamin Howard my land and all my free small estate to be equally divided between my three Daughters to wit, Elizabeth Hicks, Charity Elliott, Susan Garrison & say I Will and bequeath my negro woman Leana to be sold to a highest bidder and one half of the money arising for her I Will and bequeath to my Son Joseph Howard, and the other half to be equally divided amongst my lawful and or lawless heirs. I wish the before mentioned property to be valued on a Credit of nine months, signed and acknowledged in the presence of us this 30th day of February the year above written
