In the name of God amen. I Robert Terry of Henderson County
Kentucky reflecting that all men are created and being some the
weak of body but of perfectly sound mind and, making done
and ordained by my last Will and Testament in manner and
form following to wit. I my wife and I have by my execution as done by my
beloved daughter Patsy the following named Slaves viz Martha
Jin Charity and her child Amy W. Martha and I do likewise
give and devise to my said daughter in fee Simple the house
and lot in the town of Henderson on which I now live when
ever her mother by Death or by choice may leave it as a
residence. I then I gave and devise to my Son Nathaniel
my farm on the Ohio river above the town of Mondaca with
all tract on which it is situated. I do hereby bequeath to the care
of his mother as herein after expressed. I then I gave and devise
to my beloved wife the right of choosing out of my Estate
any one Slave which she may prefer to be disposed of as she
may think proper in her own right. I then I bequeath of my
Estate both real and personal I gave and devise unto my
said beloved wife Nancy for and during her natural
Life. It is thus my will I desire that it be equally divided
between my three youngest children. Ann. Sarah B. Nathaniel
Nevertheless if my beloved wife Nancy should at any time
deem it best for the interest of her family to change her residence
to another County it is my will and desire that she shall
have the right and Power to sell and convey all my Lands
in Kentucky (Except the House and lot here in before bequeath
to my Daughter Patsy) and to best the money arising from

Such sales in lands elsewhere which I or we shall be
divided between my eldest three youngest children
them. The Henderson Circuit Court at the term thereof do order
me upon a mortgage certain property belonging to Obadiah
Smith and with regard to this property it is my will & desire that
my executors at their discretion sell so much of it as will pay
debtor debts for which I became responsible on Capt. Smith's account
and the residue of any conveyed to the heirs of said Obadiah
Smith. I recently purchased at a sale held by commissioners
the house and lot in the town of Henderson at present occupied
by Robert Speed and executed my bond to the said commissioners
for the payment of the purchase money. Now with respect
to this property it is my will and desire if the heirs of Robert
Speed or any one for them will exonerate my estate from the
payment of said bond for the purchase money aforesaid that
my executors shall then convey by deed of relinquish or
or a special warranty the said House & lot together with the
fractional part which I hold of the lot North East and
adjoining thereto bequeathed to my daughter Patsy and
also one hundred acres of land be it more or less lying
near the residence of Bennett Sandiford in Henderson
County purchased by me some time ago at a Sheriff's sale
as the property of William Collins to the heirs of said Robert
Speed or to some individuals who shall be chosen by them
rather than said Robert Speed. And lastly I do hereby
constitute & appoint my beloved wife Nancy Perry and my
