Whereas James Williams late of Henderson County hath departed this life having full mind and published his last will and Testament in writing bearing date the 5th day of August 1822, which is to be amended and whereas Mary Pate a subscribing Witness thereto cannot conveniently travel to the County Court of Henderson County to be examined and sworn to as some witnesses and place by you to be appointed you call and cause the said Mary Pate the Witness aforesaid to come before you and her allegedly examine on the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God whether the said Testator signed said and released the same as and for his last will and Testament in her presence and whether the said Testator was of sound mind and disposing memory at the time of the signing thereof and her execution thereof being sworn that you solemnly and truly without delay and artifice to us and alone sending is also the will, Altho' H. H. Grigsby Clerk of our said Court at the Courtroom the 5th day of August 1822 and in the 2nd year of the Commonwealth. H. H. Grigsby Clerk of the County of Tennessee.

The day we have caused to come before us James G. Swisher and David James Swisher of the Peace and for the County aforesaid Mary Pate and after being duly sworn on the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God swears in his oath aforesaid that she saw the said Williams late of Henderson County Kentucky sign seal and deliver his last will and Testament and further that she believed him to be of sound mind and disposing memory when and where the 5th day of October 1822 at the house of James Peregine in the County of Henderson County aforesaid.

We the undersigned having been appointed by the Honorable County Court of Henderson, Commissioners, to settle to the widow Turner her dower in the estate of William Turner deceased and also to divide the estate between the heirs of said Turner dec^d: report as follows to wit:

We find from the amount of the appraisement and also that the whole of the estate is \$966.18 Cents, the widow or third part of this three hundred & twenty two Dollars & 18 Cents of sum we allotted the widow two feather beds and furniture at \$18. One Cow & Calf at \$8. one Bottom wheel & half dozen Cups & saucers at \$1.38 amounting in all to \$27.38 leaving a balance of \$244.68 Cents - this sum we allotted to her in money or Cash notes, that is to say she is to have the \$244.68 out of a note given to Alfred Turner administrator is by Sterling Pool and Robert Smith for \$370.25 cents, due the 5th day of August 1831.

We have proceeded to divide the balance of the estate between the heirs as follows: We allotted to Alfred Turner \$75.57 and the balance of the note on said Sterling Pool and Robert Smith also \$54.12 Cents the amount he bought at the sale, also \$36.81 Cents in notes we also allot him \$47.80 Cents which Polly Turner or Haywood Mores her guardian is to pay said Alfred when the money becomes due also \$10 Cents, Sparte Turner has to pay him that he received over his share which makes \$214.70 Cents the amount of ones part in the estate -

We likewise allotted to Haywood Mores guardian for Polly Turner a negro girl by the name of Peggy at \$262.50 Cents which is \$47.80 Cents more than her share which she or her guardian is to pay to Alfred Turner - take this from the \$262.50 it leaves \$214.70 Cents her share of the estate -

We also allotted to Sparte Turner a negro by name of Jack at \$175. we also allotted him the balance in note to the amount including negro by of \$215.11 Cents - he is to pay Alfred Turner 41 Cents which leaves him \$214.70 the amount of his share in the estate. Given under our hands 8th Sept. 1830.
