one thousand Dollars but without any interest on the same
ten Years after my death but if the said Horatio K
Kewatin should fail or refuse to pay to the said Daniel
P. Wilson or to the Guardian of said Daniel P. Wilson the sum of

One thousand Dollars and I have after my death to and
 that once the said Horatio D. Swattins is to have sole
 occupy and enjoy the tract of land herein before mention-
 ed for and during the term of his natural life and after the

 emancipated and set free immediately after my death and
 I do hereby emancipate and set free the said Slaves and
 request they Executors herein after named to procure a new
 furnish the said Slaves with all proper certificates and papers
 which may be necessary and proper to insure them the
 enjoyment of their freedom after my death
 I do give and bequeath to my beloved Nephews Horatio
 D. Swattins the fallowing Slaves Fannie Monning, Milley,
 Sam. Hester, Aggy, Maria, Sally, Virginia, Sally, Manda,
 Emanuel, Isaac, Breckenridge, Laria, Jane, Henry, Robin,
 Melina, William, Thirawan, Mary, Archer, Joseph, Anna & Cottens
 for and during the term of fifteen Years together with all
 the future increase of said Slaves or all the Slaves I may
 be possessed of or be legally entitled to at the time of my
 death except the Slaves Paul Davis and Bob. which said
 Slaves above mentioned with their future increase to gather
 with all the Slaves I may be possessed of or be legally
 entitled to are to be held possessed and enjoyed by the said
 Horatio D. Swattins fifteen Years after the time of my
 death and after the expiration of the said fifteen Years
 all the Slaves before mentioned and all the Slaves of
 which I may be possessed are to be emancipated and
 set free and are to be purchased by my Executors herein
 named with all proper certificates and papers which may
 be necessary and proper to insure to said Slaves the enjoy-
 ment of their freedom and my Executors are moreover to
 do and perform all necessary and all things which may
 be proper to secure to the Slaves of which I may be pos-
 sessed or be legally entitled to the enjoyment of their free-
 dom at the time herein before mentioned and if further my
 will and desire that if the said Horatio D. Swattins should
 depart this life before my death that the tract of land
 herein before mentioned shall belong to Daniel & Wilson
 And I hereby devise the said tract of land to the said
