Down The undersigned Commissioners appointed by order of the Henderson County Court to settle the dowry of Mrs Lucy Jones into Wardlow in the slaves of her said husband, and to divide the residue of the slaves among the heirs of the said James C Wardlow, have discharged their duty as follows - They allotted to Mrs L B Jones the Negroes Ben, Judy, Nancy, Octavius and Nash, valued by them at \$1300. To Samuel Wardlow the Negroes, Ben, Judy, Tom, Anna and Susan valued at \$875. To Mary Wardlow the Negroes, Richard, Harriet, Betsey and Georgiana valued by them at \$925. And to Ann Eliza Wardlow the Negroes, George, Jimmy, Burnell and James valued by them at \$950. These valuations tho' not exactly equal are as near as they could be made, and that Mary C Wardlow pay to

Sam^l William \$87 1/2 and that Ann Eliza pay to him \$33. 1/2 to make all their portions equal. all of which is respectfully submitted.

Agreeably to the annexed order of the Henderson County Court the undersigned Commissioners, being first duly sworn proceeded on the 27th day of December 1827, to divide the negroes belonging to the estate of Thomas Bell deceased among Selah Bell the widow and Thomas M Bell and Harriet C Bell children of the said Thomas Bell deceased agreeably to the will of said decedent, and allotted the negroes in the following manner to wit To Selah Bell the negroes Laves Israel, Mary, Dinah, Gabriel, Jacob, Robin and Franky. To Thomas M Bell the negro slaves, Nathan, William, Moses, Davy, Charles, Maria, Henry, George, Ben, Eliza, Martha & Ross. & To Harriet C Bell Charlotte & Child Betty, Emory, James, Lewis, Sally, Amy, Phil, Betty, Jacob, Henry, Spauldia, Nathan & Jack.

The slaves were valued at the following prices: viz

Robin \$250, Franky 132.50 Phil 250, Betty, Jacob 235, Hariah 300, George 120 Henry 100, Charlotte & Betsey her child 300 William 400 David 300 Charles 300 Davy 250. Martha 150, Ben 150 Jack 330, Jacob 400 Nathan 400, Sally & Amy her child 350, Isabella 125 Nathan 125, Emory 250, James 400 Henry 57.50, Moses 350, Lewis 400 Eliza 300 Gabriel 300 Mary 225, Lavel 250. Total 58, amounting in the whole to \$7892.50cts.

We further adjudge and determine that the said Thomas M Bell pay to the said Selah Bell the sum of fifteen dollars thirty one and a half cents. and that the said Harriet C Bell the sum of fifty dollars thirty one and a half cents - Given under our hands this 27th day of December 1827.

The New Division

In Obedience to the original and amended order hereto annexed: We have this 28th day of May 1828. for us proceeded to divide the estate of Thomas Bell deceased in manner following

At the former division the circumstance of the negro woman Kinney allotted to Harriet C Bell being afflicted with fits was not adverted to by the Commissioners who have reduced her valuation from One Hundred of fifty Dollars to fifty seven dollars and a half which is the only alteration in the former division and valuation of the negroes. The Commissioners have allotted to Mr. Selah Bell 150 acres designated on the plat of the land hereto annexed as lot 1. to Harriet C Bell 200. acres of land designated by the number 2. and to Thomas M Bell Two Hundred acres of land, designated by the number 3. on said plat and survey made by John Green deputy surveyor of Edmund Talbot surveyor of Henderson County hereto annexed & made a part of this report. lot number 3. was deemed by the Commissioners of less value than lot number 2. by seventy five dollars.

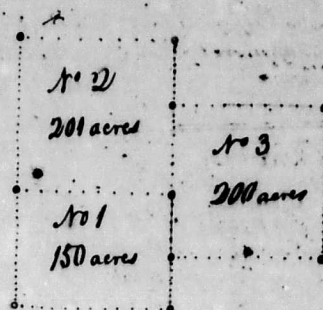

We therefore award and determine that Mrs Selah Bell pay to Thomas M Bell the sum of fifty five Dollars 31 1/2 cts and that Harriet C Bell pay Thomas M Bell the sum of twenty two Dollars 26 1/2 cts in full discharge of the sum of \$77.78 1/2 cts reported to be due him - the former report hereto annexed so far as regards the payment of money is consequently null and void. Many articles were not divided by the Commissioners but a sale of them recommended to Mrs Bell administratrix of Thomas Bell deceased, in preference to a division in kind which would have been next to an impossibility - Given under our hands, the day and year first above mentioned -

We the undersigned Commissioners have this day proceeded to settle the administration account, account of Mrs Silas Bell, on the estate of Thomas Bell deceased, which from the manner in which the accounts have been kept we find extremely difficult. We have however agreed upon the following report. It appears from the

Will of Thomas Bell that his widow, Selah Bell, was entitled to the Slaves and other property until one of the children attained the age of twenty one years, and th^r after that period she was entitled to one fourth part of the Slaves &c. Thoma Bell attained the age of twenty one years in Sept 1826. So that for that year Mrs Bell is chargeable for one third of the hire, which amounting to \$588. She is chargeable with the sum of \$196 and with the sum of \$587.75 for the hire of the negroes in the year 1827, amounting in the whole to sum of \$783.75 and leaving a balance due to Selah Bell from Thos Bell estate of \$214. and 25 cts. Selah Bell is also strictly entitled to the further sum of \$2890 cts for 5 per cent Commission on the sum of \$9778 above mentioned. Therefore we recommend a settlement of the accounts in the manner above stated - Mrs Selah Bell was entitled to one fourth of the hire above charged to her which we have omitted thinking it probable that her portion of the expenditure amounted to that sum - Given under our hands this 24th day of April 1829 -
