Ky: Kentucky being low in body, but sound and perfect in judgment and
memory, do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and
form as follows - Item - I give and bequeath to my brothers, Brown
and Alexander Brown, the tract of land on which I now live,
to them and their heirs to be equally divided, If my brother Alexander
should die without issue and before his brother, in this event, Brown
Brown is to inherit the whole of my land. It is my will and
desire that my slaves shall be sold in family, and not parted from
their children, my crop now growing, my stock of every description
and all the balance of my estate, which I may die possessed of, not
mentioned, after my just debts are paid, the balance arising from the
sale to be equally divided between my brothers, sisters, It is my desire my
Executor pay no interest for any money he may hold in his hands until
my estate is fairly settled and legally demanded by the parties interested
And lastly I hereby appoint my brother Brown Brown
Executor of this my last Will and Testament - Witness my
