how uncertain human life is do make this my last will & testament
first I resign my soul to God who gave it to me and my
body to be buried in the bowels of the earth. Article the first
I will and it is my desire that all my just and heredit to be paid
to be will and bequeath unto my Loving wife Sarah Stott all my
Landed property and negroes for her own proper use as long as
she may live and after her death to be divided in the following
manner to wit: Article 2^d I will and bequeath unto my
son Christopher Stott one hundred Acres of land to begin at
my Lower corner on the bank of the Ohio river up the river
fifty rods and back for quantity so as to make the afore said
one hundred acres of land and further it is my will and desire
and bequeath unto the said Christopher a negro girl name Luth
and a Negro boy to him the said Christopher for ever. Art 3^d
I do will and desire and bequeath unto my daughter Nancy Stott a negro
woman named Vela and negro girl named Ginny together with all
their increase to have the afore said Negroes so long as she may and then
to go to the lawful heirs of her body and further and further it is my
will and desire that if perchance that she should die without any lawful
heirs of her body the afore mentioned Negroes to be equally divided between

My three sons Christopher Ephraim and Washington Stott
Art 5th I do will and desire and I bequeath unto my son Ephraim
Stott one hundred Acres of land the tract I purchased of
Joshua Pop known by the Vackerk place and I further
will and bequeath to him a Negro man named James and a
Negro girl Leahy for his own for ever,
Art 6th I do will and desire and bequeath unto my son Washington
Stott one hundred Acres of Land to be given at the upper corner christen
running up the river fifty rods and back for quantity is as to make the
one hundred Acres of Land and I further will and bequeath to him
Washington any grave by James Kidd and a negro girl named Chang
to him for ever. Art 7th and further it is my will and desire that
my wife Sarah Stott and my son Christopher Stott and I do by these
presente nominate and appoint them my Executors and Executor comy
into effect the afore said Articles of this Last will and desires and further
it is my will and desire that they shall sell all the rest of my
property not named in this will as twelve months credit and after
paying all demands against my estate and the ballance of the money
if any is to remain in the hands of my wife so long as she lives and
then it is my will and desire for it to go to my son Ephraim Stott and
further it is my will and desire that my son Christopher shall
have one penny for every day respectively employed in discharging the
