The undersigned Commissioners appointed by the County Court of Henderson to examine and state the accounts and vouchers of the executor, of Robert Church deceased with the said estate have proceeded to the discharge of that duty, and for an account of their proceedings refer the Court to the account and vouchers herewith returned. It will be seen that in this statement Richard Church one of the executors has charged the estate with 200 Dollars for services rendered on the plantation of the deceased for four years, during which time the estate was divided directed to undivided, and consequently was under the exclusive charge of the said Richard. The Commissioners have thought it right to allow the said Richard Church a Commission of five per cent on 448 Dollars, which makes a balance due the estate of Robt Church of three Dollars forty two and 1/4 Cents.
