Negro girl named Lucy, One horse and saddle also one
feather bed of furniture, and five hundred dollars so soon
as he becomes of lawful age or marriage to him and his
heirs forever. Item. — I give and bequeath to my daughter
Mary Eliza two Negroes Namely Amy and Mary Anne
One horse and saddle and one feather bed furniture
to her and her lawful heirs forever. Item. I give bequeath
to my son James Eliza One Negro boy named Robert
and One equal undivided half of the tract of Land
I now live on, One horse and saddle and one feather
bed and furniture to him and his heirs forever. Item
I give and bequeath to my son Joseph Perry two negroes Rachel
and her child Sam and the undivided half of the
tract of Land on which I now live Also one horse and
saddle and one feather bed and furniture to him this
Item. It is to be understood that these infant
legacies do not receive their portions until they arrive at lawful
age or marriage. Item. — It is my will that all and singular
the residue of my property not heretofore specified be at the
death or intermarriage of my wife equally divided Among my
six children as heretofore stipulated to them and their heirs forever
Item. I had under my wife during her natural life or marriage
all the residue of my estate real and personal not heretofore
given to be kept together with the infant Children legacies
for the purpose of raising and educating said infants and
further should either of the said infants fraudulently have the
bequeathed property given to the said specified, for them to
receive it, that they shall be reimbursed out of the said
residue as above mentioned previous to an equal division
in such way and manner as my Executor and Executrix
shall think equitably and just. Lastly it is my will and
desire and I hereby ordain constitute and appoint my son
John Anthony Lambot and my wife Eliza to my Executor
and Executrix of this my last will and Testimony. In witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand seal this 8th day of July
1820.

no Kirby make this my last will and Testament hereby testifying
and confirming the same. First I recommend my soul to that
place from whence it comes hoping in a full pardon of all its
Offenses Against the holy law and a full enjoyment of eternal
happiness hereafter. Thirdly — It is my desire that all my just debts
be paid. — I give my son Hugh Gibson unity three acres of
Land lying on creek being the one half of the tract pur-
chased of Samuel Scott and four negroes by the name of Harry
Andy, Nancy and Kitly and all my stock of horses, cattle, sheep &
hogs and all my household and kitchen furniture except one
Piano and furniture and my crop that is now growing and all
my plantations likewise. Item. — I give to my daughter Martha
Prout two negroes by the name of Sally and Hannah and two
Beds and furniture. Item. — I give to my daughter Ellen Carroll
One negro by the name of Lucy and two beds and furniture.
Item. — I give my son George McCorraugh Gibson One negro by the
name of portion under one bed and furniture and one horse
saddle and Bridle and one half of the money that is coming to
me from Robert McCorraugh Esq of Virginia. Item. — I give to
my grand daughter Elizabeth Prout the other half of my money that
is in the hands of Robert McCorraugh Esq of Virginia. I appoint
my son Hugh Gibson my executor. Given under my hand seal this
twenty eighth day of August One thousand eight hundred and
sixty two. —

and have made Ordained and published, and used by these presents
to make Ordain and publish this my last will and Testament thereby
revoking and Cancelling all other will or wills by me heretofore made
or published —

First it is my will that all my just debts be paid as soon as
possible, for which purpose I do hereby Appoint my friend Jacob Ball
(of Indiana and State of Indiana) and my brother William Hart
(of Kentucky) Executors of this my last will and Testaments giving to
them or either of them the power to sell and convey all or any part
of my real and personal estate lying in the State of Indiana and
Kentucky or elsewhere at such times, and in such manner as they or either
of them I shall think most beneficial to the parties concerned. —

Secondly — I wish them to pay unto Doctor William S. Webb of
Williamson County in the State of Tennessee the sum of Three hundred
and Thirty Dollars, for money by him furnished me during my minority.

Thirdly — I do give and bequeath unto my friend Jacob Ball, my big
arm'd Chair and bear skin and white bed quilt —

Fourthly — I give unto my Sister Susan Bowar all my wearing
Apparel.

And fifthly I give and bequeath and devise all the rest and
residue of my estate, both real and personal and personalty wherever
the same may be found (After the payment of all my debts, and the
obligations of the legacies aforesaid) unto my brother William Hart
in trust and to the uses and benefits of the Children of my said
Sister Susan Bowar, to be Appointed at such times, and in such
manner as he my said Brother (with the advice and consent of my
fair Sister shall think most to the advantage and benefit of
the said Children in Testimony whereof I have hereunto my hand
and Seal this 17th day of December in the year of our Lord One
thousand eight hundred and twenty two. —
