E. B. Barbour For the Name of God Amen - I Elizabeth B. Barbour, being weak in body, but sound in mind, and remembering that it is appointed for us all to die, and that from my age and infirmities, I cannot expect to have many months longer, do in view of these facts make and Ordain this as my last Will and Testament, in manner and form following to-wit:

I give most freely and joyfully my soul to the God who made me, and for him preserved me, through a long life of trials and difficulties, and whom I have tried to obey and serve through the Lord Jesus Christ, and in the strength & influence of the Holy Ghost for many years, and by whose Grace & power, & mercy I have a sure & steadfast hope of a glorious resurrection & happiness ineffable beyond the grave - I give my body to the earth to be buried in a decent and Christian manner -

As to the property & estate which I own, my will and desire is that all my just debts be paid by my Executor hereinafter named, I give and bequeath to my Grand Son Owen Hays Three Hundred Dollars, which is to be raised by my executor out of the first hire of my negro man John, which may accrue after my death, and is to be done as the sum is realized from the hire of my said negro man John as aforesaid after my death, I wish my said Executor to pay the same over to the Guardian of the said Owen Hays - I give and bequeath to my Grand Daughter Anna M. Barbour the sum of Three Hundred Dollars, which is to be raised by my executor out of the first money which may accrue from the hire of my negro man Jim, after my death, and to be paid to the said Anna when she arrives at the age of twenty one years, or marries, or becomes of my Executor choose - I give and bequeath to my Executor William S. Jones my negro man Peter (viz young Peter) in trust for the following purposes viz: He is to hire out said negro and if practicable, keep him hired out, & take the proceeds, and as collected put them out at interest until Philip Barbour & Hays Barbour the children of my son Samuel H. Barbour shall be old enough to go to school, and then my Executor shall apply the fund thus raised

and also the accruing hire of said negro Peter, to the sole purpose of educating the said Philip & Hays Barbour or the survivor of them - And when the said Philip & Hays Barbour or the survivor of them shall attain the age of twenty one years the said negro man Peter, and the balance of his hire & the interest thereon which may remain unsatisfied shall quit absolutely in them or the survivor of them - I give and bequeath to my Grand son Philip Jones my negro boy Emory in absolute right - But if my Grand son Owen Hays shall be before the three hundred dollars above devised are paid to his Guardian or himself, and if my Grand daughter Anna M. Barbour shall die before she receives the Three Hundred dollars above devised to her, and if Philip Barbour and Hays or Samuel Barbour (for he was first named Hays & is now called Samuel Barbour) shall both die before they attain the age of twenty one years, then it is in my will & desire that the money & property hereinbefore devised to the said Owen Hays, Anna M. Barbour, Philip Barbour & Hays or Samuel Barbour as they shall respectively & individually die as aforesaid, in this case, except Philip Barbour & Hays or Samuel Barbour, who must both die as aforesaid, shall be divided in & belong to my daughter Elizabeth Jones in her own right, separate & apart from her husband -

As much as my daughter Elizabeth Jones is my only living child, and has been for some years my nurse, my comfort, and support and her house my home in my afflictions and illness, and inasmuch as it is not my will & desire that my family be divided, to whom I am attached, I should pass into other hands than hers, and as I think, for her dutiful and affectionate kindness & attention to me during my frequent sickness, and also in my health, she deserves especial notice in my last Will & Testament, I therefore devise and bequeath to her, in her own right separate and apart from her husband, and free from all liability for his debts or responsibilities, all the real & personal of my estate hereinbefore bequeathed to others, upon the happening of the contingencies herebefore specified in relation to those others, and at her death, it is in my will that the bequest be equally divided among the children of the said Elizabeth Jones & thus have full effect - It is my will and desire that none of the bequests hereinbefore made shall take effect until all my just debts are paid - I do hereby revoke and annul all other last Wills and Testaments by me heretofore made, and I do hereby appoint my son in law William S. Jones the Executor of this my last Will & Testament - In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal the 22nd day of August 1851
