In the name of God Amen - I George W. Cabell of the County of Henderson and State of Kentucky, being sick and weak in body, but of sound mind and disposing memory (for which I thank God) and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life, and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly estate as it has pleased God to bless me with.

I give and bequeath the same in manner following, that is to say, I leave first of all that my just debts and funeral expenses be paid. I give and bequeath to my dear, beloved wife Mary, Rebecca Cabell, one third of my Farm including the houses in which now live with the improvements around about the same with timber enough to supply the same during her natural life and at her death to be equally divided among my children or their heirs according to Law. I also give and bequeath unto my wife during her natural life my negro Male boy, my negro woman Jane & their child called now with whatever their increase the said negro woman Jane may have, and at the death of my wife the same to be equally divided among my children which with their heirs after mentioned or their heirs according to Law.

I give and bequeath unto my wife all the horses on the place and a yearling Colt now on the place and a passing felly three year old pinto - I give to my wife also the mules on the place (the names of the horses and mules are James Black Leg, B. Leg)

I give to my wife my horse wagon and gear, also my two horse plow & two cow horse plows with the necessary rigging for use also horn & axes, I give to my wife also the cattle claimed to be known as hers and a cow known as the Higgins cow also ten

Heads, including the best down sheep, all the hogs on the place all the grain on the place and all the hives held and between hereafter I give to my wife also my Buggy and harness. My negro free woman on which my Lewis & negro girl, Judith, Martha and Sarah I wish to be equally divided among my children, whose names are as follow, Frank, Joseph, J. Cabell, John & Cabell, George H. Cabell, Mary F. Cabell, Nancy B. Cabell, Richard H. Cabell, Virginia, M. Cabell and M. H. Cabell, but desire that the above named negroes be retained on the place, until something transpires more permanent in relation to them or they are freed.

I desire also that the remainder of my lands be equally divided among my children above named. I give and bequeath to my son, Joseph F. Cabell a Cow calf (now named Potawatamias).

I give and bequeath to my son George H. Cabell a yearling Colt now on the place.

I give and bequeath to my three daughters Mary F. Trace, P. Virginia, M. Cabell a three year old felly natural pacer and of Louisiana stock.

All the rest and residue of my estate both real and personal of what nature soever, it may be not known before particularly disposed of, I desire may be equally divided among my several children here and before named which I give to give to them, their heirs, executors, administrators and assigns forever.
